## SENATE BILL NO. 2138

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE PENALTY FOR FRAUDULENTLY OBTAINING DISABLED 3 AMERICAN VETERAN DISTINCTIVE MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE TAGS; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 27-19-53. (1) Any legal resident of the State of 9 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 10 United States, and who is rated as having one hundred percent (100%) permanent service-connected disability by the Veterans' 11 Administration is privileged to purchase annually under this 12 subsection one (1) motor vehicle license plate or tag in his or 13 her county of legal residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) 14 in total cost, regardless of make or model of motor vehicle. The 15 16 registration year of such motor vehicle shall commence the first day of the month in which application for registration is made, as 17 provided in Section 27-19-31. 18

19 (a) Not more than one (1) such motor vehicle license
20 plate or tag shall be issued under this subsection to each such
21 qualified veteran.

(b) This section pertains only to taxes or plates forprivate passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks.

(c) Proof of ownership of a particular motor vehicle
for which a license plate or tag is requested must be shown at
time of application for such plate or tag.

27 (d) Vehicles owned by such veterans are exempt under 28 this subsection from all ad valorem and privilege taxes; however, S. B. No. 2138 \*SSO1/R563\* G3/5 05/SS01/R563 PAGE 1 29 the surviving spouse of a deceased person who was issued a license 30 plate or tag under this subsection shall be entitled to apply for 31 or retain a license tag issued under this subsection and may continue annually to renew registration for one (1) motor vehicle 32 33 license plate or tag under this subsection for as long as the 34 spouse remains unmarried. At the time of application or renewal 35 registration, a surviving spouse who desires to retain the distinctive plate or tag issued under this subsection shall file 36 with the county tax collector a sworn statement that the spouse is 37 38 unmarried. Any such vehicle when so registered shall be exempt 39 from all ad valorem and privilege taxes.

40 (2) Any person who is entitled to obtain a license tag under 41 subsection (1) of this section may be issued one (1) additional 42 such license tag for any other vehicle registered in his or her 43 name upon payment of the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad 44 valorem taxes and registration fees as otherwise prescribed by law 45 for the particular vehicle.

46 (3) The State Tax Commission is directed to furnish each
47 veteran obtaining a license tag under this section an emblem,
48 which the veteran shall attach securely to the tag, showing that
49 the tag was issued to a disabled American veteran.

50 (4) A license issued under this section shall not be51 transferable to any other person.

52 (5) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of 53 this section, or attempting to secure benefits under this section 54 to which he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, 55 upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One Thousand Dollars 56 (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for not less than six 57 (6) months, or both.

58 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 59 and after its passage.
