SENATE BILL NO. 2180

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-7-13 AND 73-7-16, MISSISSIPPI
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2	CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS FOR
3	COSMETOLOGISTS SHALL INCLUDE ANY HIGH SCHOOL VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL
4	EDUCATION PROGRAM IN COSMETOLOGY APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD FOR
5	COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES, AND TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH APPROVED
6	VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL COURSES SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM LICENSURE BY THE
7	STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-7-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 73-7-13. (1) The board shall admit to examination for a
- 12 cosmetology license any person who has made application to the
- 13 board in proper form, has paid the required fee, and who (a) is at
- 14 least seventeen (17) years of age, (b) can read, write and speak
- 15 English, (c) has successfully completed no less than fifteen
- 16 hundred (1500) hours over a period of no less than nine (9) months
- in an accredited school of cosmetology or any high school
- 18 vocational-technical education program in cosmetology approved by
- 19 the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, and (d) has a
- 20 high school education or its equivalent.
- 21 The board may, in its discretion, issue to any student who
- 22 has completed the prescribed hours in an accredited school in
- 23 Mississippi a temporary permit until such time as the next
- 24 examination may be held, but such student shall be issued only one
- 25 (1) temporary permit. Application for an examination and license
- 26 shall be accompanied by two (2) recent head photographs of the
- 27 applicant. No temporary permit will be issued an applicant from
- 28 any other state to operate a beauty salon or school of cosmetology
- 29 in this state unless in case of emergency.

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30 Applicants for the cosmetologist examination, after having 31 satisfactorily passed the prescribed examination, shall be issued a cosmetology license which until June 30, 2001, shall be valid 32 33 for one (1) year, and after July 1, 2001, shall be valid for two 34 (2) years, and all those licenses shall be subject to renewal. 35 Any barber who can read, write and speak English and has successfully completed no less than fifteen hundred (1500) hours 36 in an accredited barber school, and who holds a current valid 37 certificate of registration to practice barbering and who holds a 38 current valid license, is eligible to take the cosmetology 39 40 examination to secure a cosmetology license upon successfully completing five hundred (500) hours in an accredited school of 41 42 cosmetology or in a high school vocational-technical education 43 program in cosmetology approved by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges. All fees for application, examination, 44 registration and renewal thereof shall be the same as provided for 45

- 47 (2) Each application or filing made under this section shall 48 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in 49 accordance with Section 93-11-64.
- (3) Any licensed cosmetologist, esthetician, manicurist or 50 51 wigologist who is registered but not actively practicing in the State of Mississippi at the time of making application for 52 renewal, may apply for registration on the "inactive" list. 53 54 "inactive" list shall be maintained by the board and shall set out the names and post office addresses of all persons registered but 55 56 not actively practicing in this state, arranged alphabetically by name and also by the municipalities and states of their last known 57 professional or residential address. Only the cosmetologists, 58 59 estheticians, manicurists and wigologists registered on the 60 appropriate list as actively practicing in the State of

Mississippi shall be authorized to practice those professions.

For the purpose of this section, any licensed cosmetologist, S. B. No. 2180 *SSO1/R369*

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cosmetologists.

- 63 esthetician, manicurist or wigologist who has actively practiced
- 64 his or her profession for at least three (3) months of the
- 65 immediately preceding license renewal period shall be considered
- 66 in active practice. No cosmetologist, esthetician, manicurist or
- 67 wigologist shall be registered on the "inactive" list until the
- person has furnished a statement of intent to take such action to 68
- 69 the board. Any licensed cosmetologist, esthetician, manicurist or
- 70 wigologist registered on the "inactive" list shall not be eligible
- for registration on the active list until either of the following 71
- conditions have been satisfied: 72
- 73 Written application shall be submitted to the State
- 74 Board of Cosmetology stating the reasons for such inactivity and
- 75 setting forth such other information as the board may require on
- an individual basis and completion of the number of clock hours of 76
- 77 continuing education as approved by the board; or
- 78 (b) Evidence to the satisfaction of the board shall be
- 79 submitted that they have actively practiced their profession in
- 80 good standing in another state and have not been guilty of conduct
- 81 that would warrant suspension or revocation as provided by
- 82 applicable law; and
- (c) Payment of the fee for processing such inactive 83
- 84 license.
- SECTION 2. Section 73-7-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 85
- 86 amended as follows:
- 87 73-7-16. All schools of cosmetology or school owners shall
- have a school license and shall pay to the board the required 88
- 89 license fee annually therefor. A grace period of sixty (60) days
- 90 will be given in which to renew the license, and upon the
- expiration of the grace period of sixty (60) days, any applicant 91
- for the renewal of a school license will be required to pay a 92
- 93 delinquent fee in addition to the renewal fee. The board is
- 94 hereby authorized and empowered to promulgate necessary and
- reasonable rules and regulations for the issuance and renewal of 95

96	school licenses. However, the board shall not refuse to issue or
97	renew a school's license because of the number of schools already
98	in that area of the state, and any rule promulgated by the board
99	for that purpose shall be null and void. Any high school
100	vocational-technical education program in cosmetology approved by
101	the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall be exempt
102	from the requirement for a license provided under this section.
103	Each application or filing made under this section shall
104	include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
105	accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
106	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
