SENATE BILL NO. 2254

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 25-15-3 AND 37-6-13, MISSISSIPPI 1 2 CODE OF 1972, TO INCLUDE MEMBERS OF LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS IN THE 3 STATE AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 25-15-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 8 [Through June 30 of the year in which Section 25-11-143 9 becomes effective as provided in subsection (1) of Section 10 25-11-143, this section shall read as follows:] 25-15-3. For the purposes of this article, the words 11 and phrases used herein shall have the following meanings: 12 13 (a) "Employee" means a person who works full time for the State of Mississippi and receives his compensation in a direct 14 payment from a department, agency or institution of the state 15 16 government and any person who works full time for any school 17 district, community/junior college, public library or university-based program authorized under Section 37-23-31 for 18 19 deaf, aphasic and emotionally disturbed children or any regular nonstudent bus driver, and members of the school board of any 20 21 school district. This shall include legislators, employees of the legislative branch and the judicial branch of the state and 22 "employees" shall include full-time salaried judges and full-time 23 24 district attorneys and their staff and full-time compulsory school attendance officers. For the purposes of this article, any 25 26 "employee" making contributions to the State of Mississippi retirement plan shall be considered a full-time employee. 27

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(b) "Department" means the Department of Finance andAdministration.

30 (c) "Plan" means the State and School Employees Life31 and Health Insurance Plan created under this article.

32 (d) "Fund" means the State and School Employees33 Insurance Fund set up under this article.

34 (e) "Retiree" means any employee retired under the35 Mississippi retirement plan.

36 (f) "Board" means the State and School Employees Health37 Insurance Management Board created under Section 25-15-303.

25-15-3. For the purposes of this article, the words and

SECTION 2. Section 37-6-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 67 amended as follows: 68

37-6-13. (1) Each person serving as a member of the school 69 70 board of any school district shall receive per diem in the amount 71 of Sixty-seven Dollars (\$67.00) for no more than thirty-six (36) meetings of the school board during any one (1) fiscal year or, in 72 73 his or her discretion, irrevocably may choose to receive as 74 compensation for his or her services an annual salary in the 75 amount of Two Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00), which 76 choice shall remain in force for all successive terms or periods of service of that member. The receipt of the compensation shall 77 78 not entitle any member of a school board to receive or be eligible for any * * * retirement * * * benefits, however, any member of 79 80 the school board may elect to enroll in the State and School Employees Health Insurance Plan created under Section 25-15-3 et 81 82 Each member shall be reimbursed for the necessary expenses seq. and mileage in attending meetings of the school board. 83 In addition to the foregoing, all members may be reimbursed for 84 85 mileage and actual expenses incurred in the further performance of their duties, including attendance at any mandatory school board 86 87 training session or at regional and national education meetings, 88 when such mileage and other expenses are authorized by the board prior to the date on which they occur. Detailed vouchers shall be 89 submitted for reimbursement for all expenses authorized by this 90 91 section. Such reimbursement shall be in accordance with Section 92 25-3-41.

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93 Such expenses shall be paid on order of the school board by 94 pay certificates issued by the superintendent of the school 95 district involved against the funds available for payment of the 96 administrative expense of the district.

97 (2) (a) If a member of a school board misses twenty percent (20%) or more of the meetings of the school board during a 98 calendar year, except for absences caused by required military 99 duty, the member must reimburse the school district that portion 100 101 of the total salary paid to the member that year which is proportionate to the number of meetings missed by the member in 102 103 relation to the total number of school board meetings held during 104 that year. For purposes of this subsection, consideration may be 105 given only to meetings of which public notice is required.

(b) Before February 1 of each year, the president of each local school board shall submit a report to the State Board of Education containing the names of any members of the school board who missed twenty percent (20%) or more of the school board meetings during the preceding calendar year.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005.
