- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** (1) It is unlawful for a person to shine a light
- 7 from a public road onto the adjoining lands of another during the
- 8 night from one-half (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour
- 9 before sunrise. This section does not apply to the normal use of
- 10 headlights of a vehicle traveling on a public road, to law
- 11 enforcement, emergency or utility personnel in the performance of
- 12 their duty, or to a lessee on lands leased by the lessee.
- 13 (2) Any person convicted of a violation of this section
- 14 shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars
- 15 (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by
- 16 imprisonment in the county jail for not less than sixty (60) days
- 17 nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and
- 18 imprisonment.
- 19 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 20 and after July 1, 2005.
