SENATE BILL NO. 2272

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-1-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 CLARIFY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO EXPEND 2 3 FEDERAL FUNDS FOR TRAINING EXPENSES AND SALARY INCENTIVES FOR LICENSED TEACHERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-1-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 37-1-3. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules 8 9 and regulations and set standards and policies for the 10 organization, operation, management, planning, budgeting and programs of the State Department of Education. 11 12 (a) The board is directed to identify all functions of 13 the department that contribute to or comprise a part of the state system of educational accountability and to establish and maintain 14 within the department the necessary organizational structure, 15 16 policies and procedures for effectively coordinating such 17 functions. Such policies and procedures shall clearly fix and delineate responsibilities for various aspects of the system and 18 19 for overall coordination of the total system and its effective 20 management. The board shall establish and maintain a 21 (b) system-wide plan of performance, policy and directions of public 22 23 education not otherwise provided for. 24 The board shall effectively use the personnel and (C) resources of the department to enhance technical assistance to 25 26 school districts in instruction and management therein. (d) The board shall establish and maintain a central 27 28 budget policy. *SS26/R507.1* S. B. No. 2272 G1/2

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(e) The board shall establish and maintain within the
State Department of Education a central management capacity under
the direction of the State Superintendent of Public Education.

32 (f) The board, with recommendations from the 33 superintendent, shall design and maintain a five-year plan and 34 program for educational improvement that shall set forth 35 objectives for system performance and development and be the basis 36 for budget requests and legislative initiatives.

37 (2) (a) The State Board of Education shall adopt and 38 maintain a curriculum and a course of study to be used in the 39 public schools that is designed to prepare the state's children 40 and youth to be productive, informed, creative citizens, workers 41 and leaders, and it shall regulate all matters arising in the 42 practical administration of the school system not otherwise 43 provided for.

Before the 1999-2000 school year, the State Board (b) 44 45 of Education shall develop personal living and finances objectives 46 that focus on money management skills for individuals and families for appropriate, existing courses at the secondary level. 47 The 48 objectives must require the teaching of those skills necessary to 49 handle personal business and finances and must include instruction 50 in the following:

Opening a bank account and assessing the 51 (i) quality of a bank's services; 52 53 (ii) Balancing a checkbook; (iii) Managing debt, including retail and credit 54 55 card debt; (iv) Completing a loan application; 56 57 (v) The implications of an inheritance; 58 (vi) The basics of personal insurance policies;

59 (vii) Consumer rights and responsibilities; 60 (viii) Dealing with salesmen and merchants; 61 (ix) Computing state and federal income taxes; 5. B. No. 2272 05/SS26/R507.1

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62 (x) Local tax assessments; 63 (xi) Computing interest rates by various mechanisms; 64 65 (xii) Understanding simple contracts; and 66 (xiii) Contesting an incorrect billing statement. 67 (3) The State Board of Education shall have authority to expend any available federal funds, or any other funds expressly 68 designated, to pay training, educational expenses, salary 69 70 incentives and salary supplements to licensed teachers employed in local school districts or schools administered by the State Board 71 72 of Education. Such incentive payments shall not be considered part of a school district's local supplement as defined in Section 73 74 37-151-5(o), nor shall the incentives be considered part of the local supplement paid to an individual teacher for the purposes of 75 Section 37-19-7(1). MAEP funds or any other state funds shall not 76 be used to provide such incentives unless specifically authorized 77 78 by law. 79 The State Board of Education shall through its actions (4) seek to implement the policies set forth in Section 37-1-2. 80 81 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

82 and after July 1, 2005.
