SENATE BILL NO. 2302

1	AN ACT TO REQUIRE SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH LEVEL 3 OR LOWER
2	ACCREDITATION RATING TO ADOPT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES REGARDING
3	THEIR DAILY CURRICULUM, WEEKLY HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS, PARENTAL
4	INVOLVEMENT, DRESS CODES, SCHOOL HOLIDAYS, PARENT/TEACHER
5	CONFERENCES AND SCHOOL SYLLABI TO REDUCE THE AT-RISK PUPIL
6	POPULATION; TO PROVIDE THAT ALTERNATIVE SCHOOLS IN THE SAME
7	DISTRICTS PROVIDE FOR THE SAME TYPE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES; AND
8	FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPP

- **SECTION 1.** (1) The school board of every school district 10
- 11 having a Level 3 or lower accreditation rating shall adopt
- 12 policies and procedures regarding their daily curriculum, weekly
- homework assignments, parental involvement, dress codes, school 13
- 14 holidays, parent/teacher conferences and school syllabi to lower
- the at-risk pupil population for such school district. The 15
- policies and procedures shall include, but are not limited to, the 16
- 17 following:
- Every child shall be assigned daily homework 18 (a)
- 19 assignments;
- Every child shall be taught to write in proper 20
- 21 manuscript and cursive lettering, which shall be reinforced
- through weekend homework assignments at every grade level; 22
- 23 Every child shall be assigned a daily reading (C)
- assignment; 24
- Every child shall be assigned a daily written 25
- assignment to accompany the daily reading assignment to assess the 26
- reading comprehension level of the child; 27
- 28 (e) Every child shall be assigned a minimum of five (5)
- words per week in each subject area to learn to spell, define and 29

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- 30 use in a sentence, which shall be used to assess the child's
- 31 retention of the assignment;
- 32 (f) Every child shall be assigned a minimum of one (1)
- 33 book to read per subject each month and shall write a short report
- 34 on the subject matter of the book, which shall be used to assess
- 35 the child's learning ability. Children in primary grades may be
- 36 allowed to draw pictures, elaborate orally or use any other
- 37 alternative method to tell about their books;
- 38 (g) Every parent or guardian of a child shall
- 39 participate in one (1) supportive service for the school district,
- 40 such as watching the bus stop, working the concession stand for an
- 41 athletic event, chaperoning a school sponsored event, serving the
- 42 Parent Teacher Association, or serving as a mentor, resource
- 43 officer or tutor;
- (h) Every teacher shall dress in a professional manner,
- 45 which does not include wearing blue jeans, denim jeans or tee
- 46 shirts;
- 47 (i) Every child shall be required to dress in school
- 48 uniforms;
- 49 (j) The school districts shall provide for only the
- 50 following school holidays: Labor Day, Thanksgiving Holidays,
- 51 Christmas Holidays, New Year's Holidays, Dr. Martin Luther King,
- 52 Jr., Holiday, Spring Break and Good Friday. There shall be no
- 53 more permanent early release days;
- 54 (k) Staff development training shall not be held during
- 55 the use of regular school days; however, the staff development
- 56 training may be offered after the regular school day has been
- 57 completed. The staff development training shall be relevant to
- 58 the teaching experience and beneficial to the teacher, student and
- 59 district as a whole;
- (1) Parent/teacher conferences shall be held at the
- 61 middle of the nine-week term only with the parent and child who

- 62 has not mastered his or her course work for the mid-term or if the
- 63 child has demonstrated bad citizenship;
- 64 (m) The school district shall provide a syllabus for
- each nine (9) weeks with the homework assignments posted for each
- 66 subject. Each syllabus shall contain an agreement that the parent
- 67 or guardian shall be required to sign stating that they understand
- 68 the child has daily homework assignments and that they have
- 69 received a document outlining their child's work assignments and
- 70 the due dates of the assignments; and
- 71 (n) The school district shall post the syllabi on the
- 72 school district website, if one is available. If a student loses
- 73 his or her syllabi, the school district may charge a fee of not
- 74 more than Twenty-five Cents (25¢) per individual sheet to copy and
- 75 replace the document(s).
- 76 (2) Alternative school programs in school districts having a
- 77 Level 3 or lower accreditation rating shall adopt the same
- 78 policies as provided in subsection (1) of this section. Students
- 79 attending an alternative school shall attend school for no less
- 80 than eight (8) hours per day and shall attend school on Saturday
- 81 for no less than eight (8) hours per day. At these alternative
- 82 schools, Saturday shall be known as "Attitude Adjustment Day."
- 83 Each Saturday, the school districts shall arrange to have retired
- 84 military, first responders, volunteer mentors, ministers, parents
- 85 and any other community volunteers attend school with the
- 86 alternative school students and share their skills and knowledge
- 87 with the students, encouraging them to become better students and
- 88 citizens. In addition, the school district may provide that on
- 89 Saturdays, students may participate in community service programs
- 90 to help build character and concern for their own school, family,
- 91 neighborhood and community.
- 92 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 93 and after July 1, 2005.
