SENATE BILL NO. 2520 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-19-403, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE FOR STAGGERED TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE 3 BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE MISSISSIPPI INSTITUTE FOR FOREST 4 INVENTORY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 49-19-403, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

8 49-19-403. (1) (a) There is hereby created the Mississippi 9 Institute for Forest Inventory. The institute shall be governed 10 by a board of directors. The board shall consist of eleven (11) members. The Director of the Mississippi Automated Resource 11 Information System; the Executive Director of the Mississippi 12 Development Authority, or his designee; the Director of the Forest 13 and Wildlife Research Center at Mississippi State University, or 14 his designee; and the State Forester, or his designee; shall be ex 15 16 officio members with full voting power.

17 (b) The Governor shall appoint four (4) members from the state at large with the advice and consent of the 18 19 Senate. * * * The Governor shall appoint one (1) member from each of the following categories: a private nonindustrial forest 20 21 landowner, a Mississippi registered forester, a certified wildlife or fisheries biologist, and a representative of an environmental 22 23 organization. Appointments made after January 1, 2005, shall be 24 for initial terms as follows: a private nonindustrial forest 25 landowner, four (4) years; a Mississippi registered forester, 26 three (3) years; a certified wildlife or fisheries biologist, two (2) years; and a representative of an environmental organization 27

30 (c) The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint three (3) 31 members from the state at large with the advice and consent of the 32 Senate. The Lieutenant Governor shall appoint one (1) member from 33 each of the following categories: the timber harvesting industry, the forest products industry, and a citizen with forestry related 34 interests. Appointments made after January 1, 2005, shall be for 35 initial terms as follows: timber harvesting industry, four (4) 36 years; forest products industry, three (3) years; and a citizen 37 with forestry related <u>interests</u>, two (2) years. After the 38 39 expiration of the initial terms, the terms shall be for four (4) 40 years.

41 (d) Members of the board may be reimbursed for mileage 42 and actual and necessary expenses as provided under Section 43 25-3-41.

The Chairman of the Senate Forestry Committee and 44 (e) 45 the Chairman of the House Forestry Committee shall serve as members of the Joint Institute for Forest Inventory Oversight 46 47 Committee. For attending meetings, the legislators shall receive per diem and expenses from their respective contingent expense 48 49 funds at the rate authorized for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session. No per diem and expenses will be 50 51 paid for attending meetings when the Legislature is in session. 52 The board shall appoint a director of the institute who (2)serves at the will and pleasure of the board. 53

54 (3) The board shall have the following powers:

(a) To apply for, accept and expend any funds, grants or gifts from any public or private sources in furtherance of the institute's duties;

58 (b) To expend funds by appropriation or directly from59 any federal, local or private sources;

(d) To authorize the executive director with the
approval of the board to execute all contracts and agreements and
to employ such personnel as may be required to carry out the
duties of the institute; and

66 (e) To do all acts necessary to carry out the duties of67 the institute.

68 (4) All funds received by the institute shall be deposited69 in the State Treasury for the use of the institute.

70 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 71 and after passage.
