AN ACT TO PROVIDE GOOD-FAITH IMMUNITY TO CERTAIN EMERGENCY 1 MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 **SECTION 1.** (1) Emergency medical service personnel, public 5 or private, who provide emergency or nonemergency services to a patient outside a hospital, in a hospital before transferring 6 7 patient care to hospital personnel, or in a clinical setting, 8 with or without compensation, which services are consistent with 9 the individual's licensure, certification, or training, shall not be liable in a civil action for any act or omission resulting in 10 injury, death or loss to person or property unless the act or 11 omission, including bypassing of nearby hospitals or medical 12 facilities, is the result of gross negligence or willful 13 misconduct which is the proximate cause of the injury, death or 14 15 loss to person or property. The immunity extended under this act shall apply to all of the following: 16 First responders; 17 (a) Medical first responders; 18 (b) Emergency medical services drivers; 19 (C) 20 (d) Wheelchair van drivers; Emergency medical technicians, whether basic, 21 (e) 22 intermediate, or paramedic; 23 Registered nurses employed by a licensed ambulance (f) 24 service; 25 (g) Authorizing physicians or physician's designees; Medical directors, medical control authorities and 26 (h) any employee of the medical director or medical control authority; 27 *SS01/R905* S. (i) Life support agencies, ambulance companies or an
officer, member of the staff or other employee of a life support
agency or ambulance company;

31 (j) Dispatchers, telecommunications operators, or 32 persons providing communications services or lawfully operating or 33 utilizing supportive electronic communications devices as a part 34 of the emergency medical service;

35 (k) Education program medical directors, education
36 instructors, coordinators, or education program sponsors,
37 including any life support agency, hospital or other entity
38 providing the clinical setting for an education program;

39 (1) Student or clinical observers of an approved
40 education program who are participating in an education
41 program-approved clinical setting; and

42 (m) Persons and agencies participating in the
43 development and implementation of protocols and or standing
44 operating procedures.

45 (2) For the purposes of this section, the following terms
46 shall have the meanings ascribed to them unless the context
47 clearly requires otherwise:

48 (a) "Gross negligence" means conduct so reckless as to 49 demonstrate a substantial lack of concern for whether an injury 50 results;

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(b) "Willful misconduct" means intent to harm.

52 (3) The immunity granted under this section applies to all 53 services provided to a patient by the agencies, individuals and 54 entities identified, including, without limitation, the treatment, 55 transfer and transport of a patient, whether emergency or 56 nonemergency, and the use of an automated external defibrillator 57 on an individual who is exhibiting symptoms consistent with 58 cardiac distress.

59 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 60 and after July 1, 2005.
