7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. The following terms are defined as follows:
9	(a) "Mercury relay" means a product or device,
10	containing mercury added during its manufacture, that opens or
11	closes electrical contacts to effect the operation of other
12	devices in the same or another electrical circuit. Mercury relay
13	includes, but is not limited to, mercury displacement relays,
14	mercury wetted reed relays and mercury contact relays.
15	(b) "Mercury switch" means a product or device,
16	containing mercury added during its manufacture, that opens or
17	closes an electrical circuit or gas valve, including, but not
18	limited to, mercury float switches actuated by rising or falling
19	liquid levels, mercury tilt switches actuated by a change in the
20	switch position, mercury pressure switches actuated by a change in
21	pressure, mercury temperature switches actuated by a change in
22	temperature and mercury flame sensors.
23	SECTION 2. Beginning July 1, 2005, no person shall purchase
24	or accept, for use in a primary or secondary school classroom,
25	bulk elemental mercury, chemicals containing mercury or

instructional equipment or materials containing mercury added

during their manufacturer. This subsection does not apply to:

- 33 (2) Beginning January 1, 2007, no person shall sell, offer
- 34 to sell, distribute or offer to distribute a mercury switch or
- 35 mercury relay individually or as a product component. For a

- 38 component part or parts and not the entire product. This

- 58 (3) No later than July 1, 2006, the manufacturer of a

- 63 specific uses of the switch, relay, instruction or piece of
- 64 equipment by filing a written petition with the department. The
- 65 Department of Environmental Quality may grant an exemption, with
- or without conditions, if the manufacturer demonstrates the
- 67 following:
- 68 (a) A convenient and widely available system exists for
- 69 the proper collection, transportation and processing of the
- 70 switch, relay, instrument or piece of equipment at the end of its
- 71 useful life; and
- 72 (b) The specific use or uses of the switch, relay,
- 73 instrument or piece of equipment provides a net benefit to the
- 74 environment, public health or public safety when compared to
- 75 available nonmercury alternatives.
- 76 Before approving any exemption under this subsection, the
- 77 department must consult with other states to promote consistency
- 78 in the regulation of products containing mercury added during
- 79 their manufacture. Exemptions shall be granted for a period of
- 80 five (5) years. The manufacturer may request renewals of the
- 81 exemption for additional five-year periods by filing additional
- 82 written petitions with the department. The department may renew
- 83 an exemption if the manufacturer demonstrates that the criteria
- 84 set forth in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection continue to
- 85 be satisfied. All petitions for an exemption or exemption renewal
- 86 shall be submitted on forms prescribed by the department.
- The department must adopt rules for processing petitions
- 88 submitted pursuant to this subsection. The rules shall include,
- 89 but shall not be limited to, provisions allowing for the
- 90 submission of written public comments on the petitions.
- 91 (4) No later than January 1, 2006, the department must
- 92 submit to the Governor and the Legislature a report that includes
