## SENATE BILL NO. 2611

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 CREATE THE OFFENSE OF MISREPRESENTATION OF CERTAIN CONTRACTUAL 3 CLAUSES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 97-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

97-23-1. (1) (a) It shall be unlawful for any person, 7 8 firm, association or corporation to misrepresent the true nature of its business by use of the words "manufacturer," "wholesaler," 9 "retailer," or words of similar import or for any person, firm, 10 association or corporation to represent itself as selling at 11 12 wholesale, or use the word "wholesale" in any form of sale or 13 advertising unless such person, firm, association or corporation is actually selling at wholesale those items advertised for the 14 15 purpose of resale. For the purpose of this section, the term 16 "wholesale" shall be defined as a sale made for the purpose of resale by the purchaser on which a wholesale sales tax is charged, 17 18 and not one made to a consuming purchaser on which a retail sales 19 tax is charged.

20 (b) \* \* \* This <u>subsection (1)</u> shall in nowise affect or 21 prohibit a corporation from using the word "wholesale" in its 22 corporate name even though such corporation also does a retail 23 business. However, if it does a retail business, it must indicate 24 in its advertisements that such business is being conducted by its 25 retail division, or that such advertised products are to be sold 26 only at retail.

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It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association 27 (2) or corporation to enforce any contractual waiver of the 28 constitutional right to trial by jury unless the printed portion 29 30 of the contract, other than instructions for completion, is in at 31 least eight point type and the contract contains in a size equal to at least ten point bold type a specific statement that the 32 constitutional right to a trial by jury is waived. 33 34 (3) The violation of this section shall constitute a misdemeanor, and any person or firm convicted of violating this 35 section shall be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) 36 37 nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 38 39 and after July 1, 2005.
