## SENATE BILL NO. 2657

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-153, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT RESIDENT VETERANS WHO SERVED DURING A PERIOD OF 2 3 WAR OR ARMED CONFLICT MAY PURCHASE A LIFETIME LICENSE AT A REDUCED 4 FEE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-153, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 49-7-153. (1) (a) Any resident may purchase a lifetime 8 9 sportsman hunting and fishing license by filing an application in 10 the office of the department. The license shall qualify the licensee to take all fish, game and fowl, except waterfowl, 11 12 including deer and turkey, in the manner provided by law. The license shall also permit the licensee to hunt with primitive 13 weapons and bow and arrow, and to fish in the public waters of the 14 state, including the taking of crabs, oysters, shrimp and any 15 16 saltwater fish authorized to be taken under a recreational 17 license. 18 (b) Any resident who is: 19 (i) A veteran who served in the active Armed Forces of the United States during a period of war or armed 20 21 conflict and was granted an honorable discharge; or (ii) An active member of the Armed Forces of the 22 23 United States and has served during a period of war or armed 24 conflict; may purchase a lifetime sportsman hunting and fishing license at 25 26 fifty percent (50%) of the fee.

(c) The commission shall establish proof of veteran

28 status for purchase of a lifetime sportsman license at the reduced 29 fee.

30 (d) For purposes of this section, "armed forces" means
31 the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast
32 Guard.

The department may issue a resident lifetime sportsman 33 (2) 34 license at a fee to be determined by the commission at an amount not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a person 35 36 thirteen (13) years of age or older and not less than Five Hundred 37 Dollars (\$500.00) for a person under thirteen (13) years of age. All lifetime licenses shall be issued from the office of the 38 39 department. Each application for a lifetime license must be accompanied by a certified copy of the birth certificate of the 40 individual to be named as the license holder, if the individual is 41 twelve (12) years of age or under. 42

The commission shall establish proof of residency 43 (3) 44 requirements for the purchase of a lifetime license, and shall also establish such restrictions on and regulations for lifetime 45 46 licenses as it deems necessary and proper. An applicant for a resident lifetime license must have been domiciled in this state 47 48 for eighteen (18) consecutive months immediately preceding the date of his application for a license. 49 The burden of proving 50 domicile shall be on the applicant.

51 (4) \* \* \* The department may issue a native son or daughter nonresident lifetime sportsman hunting and fishing license. 52 The 53 commission shall establish the fee, but the fee shall not be less than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). The applicant 54 55 must provide a certified copy of the original birth certificate showing that the applicant was born in Mississippi and/or if the 56 57 parents' address was in Mississippi at the time of birth as shown 58 on the birth certificate or other documents and/or official 59 documents reflect that one of said parents was on active military \*SS01/R1001\* S. 60 service outside the State of Mississippi at the time of said 61 birth. Further, if the birth certificate of each parent reflects 62 that each parent was born in the State of Mississippi, then any 63 child born outside the State of Mississippi of those parents may 64 be issued a nonresident lifetime sportsman license for the above 65 set out fee.

66 (5) Any materially false statement contained in an
67 application for a lifetime license renders void the license issued
68 pursuant to that application, and subjects the applicant to
69 criminal prosecution under Section 49-7-45.

70 (6) Nothing in this section exempts an applicant for a 71 lifetime license from meeting other qualifications or requirements 72 otherwise established by law for the privilege of hunting or 73 fishing.

74 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 75 and after July 1, 2005.
