SENATE BILL NO. 2721

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT FARM-RAISED AND WILD SHELLFISH USED 1 2 FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION BE LABELED TO SHOW COUNTRY OF ORIGIN; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF 3 LABELING REQUIREMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares that the 6 7 consumer's right to know the source or origin of shellfish products for human consumption is paramount and essential to the 8 9 health, safety, and well-being of the people of this state. 10 Providing notice to the public of the country of origin of farm-raised and wild shellfish is compelling. 11 SECTION 2. For purposes of this article, the following terms 12 shall have the meaning ascribed herein unless the context 13 otherwise requires: 14 "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of 15 (a) Agriculture and Commerce of the State of Mississippi. 16 17 (b) "Direct retail sale" means the sale of shellfish directly to the consumer. 18 19 (C) "Distributor" means any person offering for sale, exchange or barter any shellfish destined for direct retail sale 20 21 in the State of Mississippi. (d) "Label" means a display of written, printed or 22 graphic matter upon or affixed to the container in which shellfish 23 is offered for direct retail sale. 24 "Labeling" means all labels and other written, 25 (e) 26 printed or graphic matter upon a shellfish product, or any of its containers or wrappers, offered for direct retail sale. 27

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"Person" includes any individual, partnership, 28 (f) 29 corporation and association or other legal entity.

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(g) "Processor" means any person engaged in handling, storing, preparing, manufacturing, packing or holding shellfish . 31

32 (h) "Retailer" means any person offering for sale 33 shellfish to individual consumers and representing the last sale 34 prior to human consumption except that restaurants and other eating establishments are hereby excluded. 35

(i) "Shellfish" means crab, lobster, oyster, shrimp, 36 37 clam and scallops in the wild and farm-raised.

38 "Wholesaler" means any person offering for sale any (j) shellfish destined for direct retail sale in the State of 39 40 Mississippi.

SECTION 3. (1) No farm-raised or wild shellfish shall be 41 offered for direct retail sale for human consumption by a 42 processor, distributor or retailer unless the shellfish is 43 44 specifically labeled to inform consumers at the final point of 45 sale of the country of origin of the shellfish.

(2) For purposes of this section, the United States is the 46 47 country of origin for farm-raised shellfish hatched, raised, harvested and processed in the United States and wild shellfish 48 49 that were harvested in the waters of the United States, a state or 50 territory of the United States and processed in a state or territory of the United States. 51

52 The commissioner may promulgate rules and regulations as (3) may be necessary for the enforcement of this act. 53

54 SECTION 4. All distributors, processors or wholesalers of 55 shellfish, distributing or selling shellfish, shall provide 56 information to each person, firm or corporation to whom they 57 distribute or sell shellfish for resale as to the country of origin of such shellfish. 58

59 SECTION 5. (1) Any person who violates any provision of this article for which no other penalty is provided by this 60 *SS01/R1189* S. B. No. 2721 05/SS01/R1189 PAGE 2

61 article shall upon conviction be subject to a fine of not more 62 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

63 (2) The commissioner may apply for and the court may grant a 64 temporary or permanent injunction restraining any person from 65 violating or continuing to violate any of the provisions of this 66 article or any rule or regulation promulgated under this article, 67 notwithstanding the existence of other remedies at law. The 68 injunction shall be issued without bond.

69 (3) It shall be the duty of each prosecuting attorney to 70 whom any violation is reported to cause appropriate proceeding to 71 be instituted and prosecuted in a court of competent jurisdiction 72 without delay.

73 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 74 and after July 1, 2005.
