SENATE BILL NO. 2958

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE LENGTH OF TIME A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 17 MUST
- 3 PRACTICE SUPERVISED DRIVING UNDER A TEMPORARY PERMIT IN ORDER TO
- 4 BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN INTERMEDIATE LICENSE AND TO ALLOW A HARDSHIP
- 5 EXCEPTION FOR TRANSPORTING THE ELDERLY OR DISABLED; TO AMEND
- 6 SECTION 63-1-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR
- 7 RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license, intermediate license or
- 12 temporary learning permit shall be issued pursuant to this
- 13 article:
- 14 (a) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 15 except as provided in this article.
- 16 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor
- 17 vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked
- 18 or suspended by this state or any other state * * * or territory
- 19 of the United States or the District of Columbia, and such
- 20 revocation or suspension period has not expired.
- 21 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is
- 22 addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs.
- 23 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of
- 24 physical or mental disability, in the opinion of the commissioner
- 25 or other person authorized to grant an operator's license, to
- 26 operate a motor vehicle on the highways with safety. However,
- 27 persons who have one (1) arm or leg, or have arms or legs
- 28 deformed, and have their car provided with mechanical devices
- 29 whereby they are able to drive in a safe manner over the highways,

- 30 if otherwise qualified, shall receive an operator's license the
- 31 same as other persons. Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to
- 32 obtaining a license.
- 33 (e) To any person who is under the age of seventeen
- 34 (17) years to drive any motor vehicle while in use as a school bus
- 35 for the transportation of pupils to or from school, or to drive
- 36 any motor vehicle while in use as a public or common carrier of
- 37 persons or property.
- 38 (f) To any person as an operator who has previously
- 39 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental
- 40 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to
- 41 mental competency.
- 42 (g) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen
- 43 (18) years who does not at the time of application present a
- 44 diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a
- 45 general education development certificate issued to the person in
- 46 this state or any other state, or documentation that the person:
- 47 (i) Is enrolled and making satisfactory progress
- 48 in a course leading to a general education development
- 49 certificate;
- 50 (ii) Is enrolled in school in this state or any
- 51 other state;
- 52 (iii) Is enrolled in a "nonpublic school," as such
- 53 term is defined in Section 37-13-91(2)(i); or
- 54 (iv) Is unable to attend any school program due to
- 55 circumstances deemed acceptable as set out in Section 63-1-10.
- 56 (h) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 57 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.
- 58 (2) All permits and licenses issued on or before June 30,
- 59 2005, shall be valid according to the terms upon which issued.
- 60 From and after July 1, 2005:

- 61 (a) A temporary driving permit may be issued to any 62 person who is at least <u>fourteen and one-half (14-1/2)</u> years of age
- 63 who otherwise meets the requirements of this article.
- (b) An intermediate license may be issued to any person
- 65 who is at least sixteen (16) years of age who otherwise meets the
- 66 requirements of this article and who has held a temporary driving
- 67 permit for at least one (1) year without any conviction under
- 68 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under
- 69 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the
- 70 <u>one-year</u> requirement for the holding of a temporary driving permit
- 71 before an applicant can qualify for an intermediate license.
- 72 (c) A driver's license may be issued to any person who
- 73 is at least <u>seventeen (17)</u> years of age who otherwise meets the
- 74 requirements of this article and who has held an intermediate
- 75 license for at least one (1) year without any conviction under
- 76 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation. Any conviction under
- 77 Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall restart the
- 78 one-year requirement for the holding of an intermediate license
- 79 before an applicant can qualify for a driver's license. However,
- 80 a person who is at least eighteen (18) years of age who has been
- 81 issued a temporary driving permit and who has never been convicted
- 82 under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving violation shall not be
- 83 required to have held an intermediate license.
- 84 (d) An applicant for a Mississippi driver's license
- 85 who, at the time of application, is at least seventeen (17) years
- 86 of age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's license
- 87 issued by another state for at least one (1) year shall not be
- 88 required to hold a temporary driving permit or an intermediate
- 89 license before being issued a driver's license.
- 90 (3) The commissioner shall ensure that the temporary driving
- 91 permit, intermediate license and driver's license issued under
- 92 this article are clear, distinct and easily distinguishable from
- 93 one another.

94 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-1-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

95 amended as follows:

96 63-1-21. (1) Every applicant for a new or original driver's

97 or operator's license, except persons holding an out-of-state

98 license, shall first obtain a temporary driving permit upon the

99 payment of a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) to the Department of Public

100 Safety and upon the successful completion of the examination

101 provided for in Section 63-1-33 and the payment of the fee for

such examination provided for in Section 63-1-43.

103 (2) A temporary driving permit entitles the holder, provided

the permit is in his immediate possession, to drive a motor

vehicle other than a motorcycle on the highways of the State of

Mississippi only when accompanied by a licensed operator who is at

107 least twenty-one (21) years of age and who is actually occupying

108 the seat beside the driver, except that the holder of a temporary

109 driving permit may provide transportation for an elderly or

110 disabled person who does not have a license without regard to the

111 seat occupied by the elderly or disabled person. A temporary

112 driving permit may be issued to any applicant who is at least

fourteen and one-half (14-1/2) years of age. A temporary driving

114 permit shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from the date

115 of issue.

116 (3) An intermediate license allows unsupervised driving from

one-half (1/2) hour after dawn to one-half (1/2) hour before dusk.

118 At all other times the intermediate licensee must be supervised by

119 a parent, guardian or other person age twenty-one (21) years or

120 older who holds a valid driver's license under this article and

121 who is actually occupying the seat beside the driver, except that

122 the holder of an intermediate license may provide transportation

123 for an elderly or disabled person who does not have a license and

124 regardless of the seat occupied by the elderly or disabled person.

125 (4) The fee for issuance of an intermediate license shall be

126 Five Dollars (\$5.00).

127	Except as otherwise provided by Section 63-1-6, every
128	applicant for a restricted motorcycle operator's license or a
129	motorcycle endorsement shall first obtain a temporary motorcycle
130	driving permit upon the payment of a fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) to
131	the Department of Public Safety, and upon the successful
132	completion of the examination provided for in Section 63-1-33, and
133	payment of the fee for said examination provided for in Section
134	63-1-43. All applicants for such temporary permit shall (a) be at
135	least fifteen (15) years of age; (b) operate a motorcycle only
136	under the direct supervision of a person at least twenty-one (21)
137	years of age who possesses either a valid driver's or operator's
138	license with a motorcycle endorsement or a valid restricted
139	motorcycle operator's license; (c) be prohibited from transporting
140	a passenger on a motorcycle; (d) be prohibited from operating a
141	motorcycle upon any controlled access highway; and (e) be
142	prohibited from operating a motorcycle during the hours of 6:00
143	p.m. through 6:00 a.m. Temporary motorcycle driving permits shall
144	be valid for the same period of time and may be renewed upon the
145	same conditions as temporary driving permits issued for vehicles
146	other than motorcycles.
147	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2005.
