- 260 facility.
- 261 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
- 262 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the

- 264 department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of
- 265 fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities
- 266 furnished to said housing. The Department of Corrections shall
- 267 not pay for the installation or monthly service of any telephone
- 268 installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction.
- 269 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
- 270 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be
- 271 authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued
- 272 interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney
- 273 General.
- 274 **SECTION 9.** No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be
- 275 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the
- 276 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles
- 277 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the
- 278 Governor in each specific case.
- 279 **SECTION 10.** None of the money herein appropriated shall be
- 280 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47,
- 281 Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an
- 282 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State
- 283 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually
- 284 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance
- 285 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General
- 286 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of
- 287 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being
- 288 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has
- 289 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated.
- 290 In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above
- 291 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive

- 292 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence
- 293 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin
- 294 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi
- 295 Department of Corrections.
- 296 SECTION 11. It is the intent of the Legislature that all
- 297 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per
- 298 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those
- 299 incarcerated in maximum security.
- 300 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 301 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 302 budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise
- available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the 303
- 304 purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for
- 305 use within the department.
- 306 SECTION 13. None of the funds appropriated herein can be
- 307 directly or indirectly associated with the ACA accreditation in
- 308 the Community Services Division.
- 309 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed 310
- 311 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three 312
- 313 percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in
- Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event 314
- 315 shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine
- 316 Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 317 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 318 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections may
- transfer between certain budgets authorized in Section 3, 319
- including Support, Medical Services, Parole Board, Farming 320
- 321 Operations, Private Prisons and Local Confinement and Regional
- 322 Facilities, both positions and funds in an amount not to exceed
- 323 twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets in the
