COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 3140

AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 971, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1974, TO REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP AND TERMS OF THE AUTHORITY; TO CHANGE THE 3 NAME OF OXFORD-LAFAYETTE COUNTY RECREATIONAL DISTRICT TO THE LAFAYETTE-OXFORD RECREATIONAL AUTHORITY; TO LIMIT THE NUMBER OF CONSECUTIVE TERMS THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE AUTHORITY MAY SERVE; TO 6 GRANT THE AUTHORITY CERTAIN ADDITIONAL POWERS AND DUTIES; TO 7 PROVIDE FOR AN ANNUAL INDEPENDENT AUDIT OF THE AUTHORITY; TO 8 AUTHORIZE THE CITY OF OXFORD, MISSISSIPPI, AND LAFAYETTE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO DONATE SERVICES AND PERSONNEL TO THE AUTHORITY; TO 9 INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF THE AD VALOREM TAX THAT MAY BE LEVIED BY 10 11 THE CITY AND THE COUNTY TO SUPPORT THE AUTHORITY; TO PROVIDE THAT THE TAX MAY BE LEVIED IF 60% OF THE VOTERS VOTING IN AN ELECTION 12 CALLED FOR SUCH PURPOSE VOTE IN FAVOR OF THE TAX; TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY TO ISSUE BONDS TO DEFRAY THE COST OF ACQUIRING, FURNISHING 13 14 15 AND EQUIPPING RECREATIONAL FACILITIES FOR THE AUTHORITY; AND FOR 16 RELATED PURPOSES. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 SECTION 1. Chapter 971, Local and Private Laws of 1974, is amended as follows: 19 Section 1. There is hereby created and established the 20 Lafayette-Oxford * * * Recreational Authority (hereinafter 21 22 referred to as the "authority"). The authority shall be governed 23 by a board of directors to be composed of seven (7) members, all of whom shall be resident citizens of Lafayette County, 24 25 Mississippi. Three (3) members shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County, three (3) members shall be 26 27 appointed by the governing authorities of the City of Oxford, Mississippi, and one (1) member shall be jointly appointed by the 28 29 Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County and the governing 30 authorities of the City of Oxford, Mississippi. The initial terms of the members first appointed to the authority shall be as 31 32 follows: (a) One (1) member appointed by the city and one (1) 33

member appointed by the county shall serve for one (1) year;

                     Immediately after the initial members are named
    and commissioned, they shall meet at the county courthouse in

    proceed to organize the authority by the election of a chairman, a

    secretary and a treasurer. Thereafter, the duly elected chairman

    shall preside at all meetings of the authority and perform all
    duties incident to this office, but the chairman shall not vote

    except in the case of a tie. In the event that the chairman is
    absent, the secretary shall preside. In the event that the

    chairman is absent, the member serving as chairman shall retain
    all voting privileges. A member may serve as chairman for not

    more than three (3) consecutive terms, but may be reelected as a

    chairman after he has not served in that position for a period of

    one (1) year or more.

         Annually after the first meeting, the authority shall hold
    its regular meeting for the election of officers and for the

    transaction of other business. It shall meet at any other time
    upon the call of the chairman.

    develop, own, manage and operate a regional park or parks,
    recreational facilities, recreation programs and similar objects
