SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 520

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY 1 CELEBRATION OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL AND DESIGNATING FEBRUARY 23, 2 3 2005, AS "ROTARY DAY" IN MISSISSIPPI. 4 WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Chicago, Illinois, was founded on February 23, 1905, when Chicago attorney Paul Harris invited three 5 business associates to a meeting to form a club to share "mutual 6 cooperation and informal friendship such as all of us had once 7 8 known in our villages"; and WHEREAS, by 1921, Rotary Clubs had been formed on six 9 continents, and the name Rotary International was adopted in 1922; 10 11 and WHEREAS, as Rotary International grew, its focus changed from 12 13 serving the business and professional needs of its members to serving communities in need, as expressed in its motto: "Service 14 15 Above Self"; and 16 WHEREAS, the Rotary Foundation, established in 1928, today garners contributions exceeding \$80 Million annually to support a 17 18 range of humanitarian grants and educational programs; and WHEREAS, in 1985, Rotary International made a commitment to 19 20 immunize all of the world's children against polio, and by the 21 Centennial of Rotary in 2005, more than \$500 Million will have 22 been committed to the eradication of polio; and WHEREAS, Rotary International, approaching its 100th 23 anniversary, consists of 1.2 million members in some 31,000 Rotary 24 Clubs in 166 countries, all committed to addressing such problems 25 26 as environmental degradation, illiteracy, world hunger and 27 children at risk:
