5 WHEREAS, in the four years that Gloria Williams has been 6 employed at the East Mississippi Correctional Facility (EMCF) 7 located in Meridian, Mississippi, the last two years as the 8 Supervisor of Education, the department has been transformed 9 through her energy and creativity, and its effects have been felt 10 throughout the whole facility; and

11 WHEREAS, GEO Group, Inc., is under contract with the 12 Mississippi Department of Corrections to manage and operate the 13 East Mississippi Correctional Facility, which houses up to 875 14 medium security and mental health adult male inmates, an increase 15 of 125 inmates from the previous contract year; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Williams' efforts have brought special 16 17 recognition to the Education Department as well as the entire facility; she has shown that she not only is an outstanding 18 19 educator, teacher and supervisor, but she is very compassionate and has a genuine concern for the inmates of this facility. 24 WHEREAS, the most impressive element of her accomplishments 25 is that she attained these high standards while serving a 26 population that is 95% special needs. EMCF is a mental health 27 correctional facility. So while she is working with individuals

28 who have an average third grade education, they also have a mental 29 disorder diagnosis; and

30 WHEREAS, since Mrs. Williams has been at EMCF, she has implemented or directly contributed to the following successes: 31 32 Academic Need Assessment established; added a Special Education 33 Teacher and ABE Teacher; implemented a three-month Substance Abuse Program; established an accelerated GED class; record number of 34 inmates received their GED; one of the highest rates of GED 35 passing scores for the State of Mississippi; record number of 36 37 students enrolled in one or more educational program (over 300 38 offered daily); more inmates are completing course work sponsored by Meridian Community College; "A" custody inmates visit the 39 40 library at designated times to read at their leisure; strong community involvement; special recognition for the department: 41 scored 100% from ACA and state accreditation (it was noted that 42 the department was one of the best); Informational Fair geared 43 44 toward helping the "soon to be released" to re-adjust to society; graduation ceremonies mirroring real high school and college 45 graduations; Fatherhood Initiative Program; Education Appreciation 46 47 Week; and art contests with the assistance of local art dealers and instructors from local school districts with the art work 48 49 displayed at the local public library, junior college and local 50 schools; and

51 WHEREAS, it is with pride that we recognize this 52 accomplishment by a dedicated employee who has inspired inmates 53 and employees alike and has set high standards for other 54 Mississippians to follow:
