- 5 CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE.
- 6 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Delta Community College "Lady
- 7 Trojans" Girls Basketball Team, under the direction of Head Coach
- 8 Burnadette McDonald, finished the season with a 19-8 overall
- 9 record; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Lady Trojans won the college's first Mississippi
- 11 Association of Community and Junior Colleges (MACJC) State
- 12 Championship title in women's basketball since 1940 by defeating
- 13 the Northwest Community College Lady Rangers 71-59 in overtime;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Lady Trojans were the first basketball team ever
- 16 from MDCC to advance to the National Junior and Community College
- 17 Athletic Association Region XXIII Basketball Tournament's "Final
- 18 Four bracket; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Coach Burnadette McDonald is in her sixth year as
- 20 Head Coach of the MDCC Lady Trojans. In that time, she has
- 21 directed the women's basketball team to one North Division title,
- 22 three consecutive appearances in the MACJC State Championship
- 23 Tournament and three consecutive appearances in the NJCAA Region
- 24 XXIII Championship Tournament. This is a school record. Coach
- 25 McDonald was named "MACJC Women's Coach of the Year for 2005;" and
- 26 WHEREAS, members of the team include: Sophomores:
- 27 Vancherrika Mitchell (Cleveland), Latisha Brown (Merigold),
- 28 Jazmine Cain (Mound Bayou), Stephanie Boggins (Brandon), Sophia

- 29 Townsend (Shelby), Shaneeka Hunt (Sidon), Franiesha Johnson
- 30 (Coldwater), and Sherelle Shipp (Wilmar, Arkansas); Freshmen:
- 31 Jessica Boyd (Gunnison), Angela Allen (Farrell), Jameica Gross
- 32 (Memphis, Tennessee), and Marie Gary (Greenwood); and Managers:
- 33 Robyne Stout and Cassie Todd; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Burnadette McDonald was an Assistant Coach for the
- 35 Delta State Lady Statesmen under Coach Lloyd Clark for nine years
- 36 before coming to MDCC. She is the former standout for the Lady
- 37 Statesmen playing for Coach Lloyd Clark from 1984 to 1987. She
- 38 was an All-Gulf South Conference pick her senior year after
- 39 leading DSU to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals and scoring
- 40 1,529 points in her 114-game career. The Madison, Mississippi,
- 41 native was also a standout (and Honor Graduate) at
- 42 Madison-Ridgeland High School where she earned all-county and
- 43 all-metro (Jackson) honors. She was a Mississippi Prep All-Star
- 44 at Madison-Ridgeland; and
- WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the
- 46 accomplishments of this group of student athletes who have brought
- 47 honor to their college, their community and to the State of
- 48 Mississippi:
