SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 600

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE 1 MISSISSIPPI DELTA COMMUNITY COLLEGE "LADY TROJANS" GIRLS 2 BASKETBALL TEAM AND HEAD COACH BURNADETTE MCDONALD FOR WINNING THE 3 MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES STATE 4 CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE. 5 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Delta Community College "Lady б 7 Trojans" Girls Basketball Team, under the direction of Head Coach Burnadette McDonald, finished the season with a 19-8 overall 8 9 record; and WHEREAS, the Lady Trojans won the college's first Mississippi 10 Association of Community and Junior Colleges (MACJC) State 11 Championship title in women's basketball since 1940 by defeating 12 13 the Northwest Community College Lady Rangers 71-59 in overtime; 14 and WHEREAS, the Lady Trojans were the first basketball team ever 15 16 from MDCC to advance to the National Junior and Community College Athletic Association Region XXIII Basketball Tournament's "Final 17 Four" bracket; and 18 19 WHEREAS, Coach Burnadette McDonald is in her sixth year as 20 Head Coach of the MDCC Lady Trojans. In that time, she has directed the women's basketball team to one North Division title, 21 three consecutive appearances in the MACJC State Championship 22 Tournament and three consecutive appearances in the NJCAA Region 23 XXIII Championship Tournament. This is a school record. 34 WHEREAS, Burnadette McDonald was an Assistant Coach for the Delta State Lady Statesmen under Coach Lloyd Clark for nine years 35 before coming to MDCC. She is the former standout for the Lady 36 Statesmen playing for Coach Lloyd Clark from 1984 to 1987. 37 She was an All-Gulf South Conference pick her senior year after 38 39 leading DSU to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals and scoring 40 1,529 points in her 114-game career. The Madison, Mississippi, native was also a standout (and Honor Graduate) at 41 42 Madison-Ridgeland High School where she earned all-county and all-metro (Jackson) honors. She was a Mississippi Prep All-Star 43 at Madison-Ridgeland; and 44
