5	Campbell of Taylorsville, Mississippi, was named MVP of the Nokia
6	Sugar Bowl after completing 11 out of 16 for 189 yards (he threw
7	for 299 yards and was only intercepted twice); and
8	WHEREAS, the Jason Campbell-led Auburn Tigers held off the
9	Virginia Tech Hokies to win the Nokia Sugar Bowl and finished the
10	2004 season undefeated (13-0); and
11	WHEREAS, Jason reminded the media how hard it is to go 13-0,
12	which included the SEC West Division Championship and the SEC
13	championship game prior to the showdown in the Sugar Bowl, telling
14	reporters that Auburn was not No. 2 behind anybody; and
15	WHEREAS, Jason's statistics in Auburn's 2004 undefeated
16	season were impressive: he played in all 13 games, was 188 for
17	270 passing for a total of 2700 yards, 20 touchdowns and 7
18	interceptions and he made 3 rushing touchdowns; and
19	WHEREAS, his career records include 552 completions, his
20	total passing yards in 4 seasons at Auburn were 7299, and his
21	completion percentage was .646; and
22	WHEREAS, in 2003 Jason completed 61.8% of his passes
23	(181-of-293) on the season and was named the Most Valuable Player
24	of the Music City Bowl engineering Auburn's winning drive in the

fourth quarter, was named the Coaches' Offensive Player of the

Week for his performance against Western Kentucky, was the

offensive recipient of the Pat Dye Leadership Award from the
