## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1652: Appropriation; State Forestry Commission.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
10	\$ 19,362,244.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
18	\$ 8,590,852.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
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27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall
28	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
29	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
30	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
31	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."
32	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
33	Section 1 and Section 2, not more than the amounts set forth below
34	shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
35	expenditure:

97	State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
98	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds

101	2005. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
102	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be submitted to
103	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
104	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
105	during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process.
106	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance

157	positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed
158	Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of
159	funds that become available to the commission. This escalation
160	shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the
161	Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent
162	with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used
163	to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme
164	wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.
165	The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds
166	shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written
167	notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal
168	Officer.
169	SECTION 8. The Forestry Commission has the authority to
170	purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter
171	Catalog and any other GSA Catalog as long as the cost of such
172	items are less than the quotes received.
173	SECTION 9. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
174	fund designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment
175	Conversion Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry
176	Commission to assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the
177	State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal
178	Property Program or by Volunteer Fire Departments through other
179	means to adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires.
180	This assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks
181	or other accessories necessary for the operation of fire
182	suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or
183	other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire
184	suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle
185	maintenance or repair.

186	The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving
187	Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and
188	services performed for Volunteer Fire Departments by the State
189	Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be
190	deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion
191	Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements
192	therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon
193	requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of
194	warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.
195	The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire
196	Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not
197	exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of
198	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State
199	Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies
200	in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and
201	shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.
202	SECTION 10. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
203	fund designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be
204	used by the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management
205	activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County,
206	Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but
207	not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities
208	and regeneration work.
209	The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by
210	monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source.
211	Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into
212	the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall
213	make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies
214	and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and
215	upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of
216	Finance and Administration.

It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving 217 218 funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct 219 220 supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall 221 remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future 222 years. 223 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 224 Executive Director of the State Forestry Commission may authorize 225 increases in major objects of expenditure in total amounts not to exceed twenty-five Percent (25%) of the appropriated amount of 226 227 each major object of expenditure, provided that other major 228 objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar 229 amount. However, no transfers shall be authorized which increase 230 the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits." 231 232 SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention of 233 234 the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce 235 236 for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal 237 Year 2006. SECTION 13. Of the funds provided herein, the sum of Three 238 239 Hundred Twenty-four Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars 240 (\$324,898.00) is hereby assessed on any non-federal special funds 241 and shall be deposited to the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, on or before October 242 1, 2005, for the purpose of reimbursing the State of Mississippi 243 244 for administrative costs. 245 SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 246 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 247

warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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249 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

250 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

251 SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from

252 and after July 1, 2005.
