House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2731

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 9 SECTION 1. (1) There is created a commission to study the 10 effectiveness and efficiency of the Mississippi Adequate Education Program (MAEP) in providing adequacy and equity in public school 11 12 funding. The commission shall, at a minimum, study and report on the following factors related to MAEP: 13 14 (a) Efficiency; 15 Selection of school districts for funding calculations; 16 17 High growth districts; (C) 18 (d) State and local contributions; Add on programs; and 19 (e) Consolidation of school districts. 20 (f) The State Board of Education shall contract with a consulting firm

- 22 that has expertise in public school funding formulas to assist the
- 23 commission with the study. The commission shall make a report of
- 24 its findings and recommendations to the Legislature by November 1,
- 2005, including any recommended legislation. 25
- (2) The commission shall be composed of the following ten 26

- 28 (a) The Chairman of the House and Senate Education
- 29 Committees;
- The Chairman of the House and Senate Appropriation 30 (b)
- 31 Committees;
- 32 Three (3) representatives to be appointed by the
- Speaker of the House; and 33

- 34 Three (3) senators to be appointed by the
- 35 Lieutenant Governor.
- (3) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after 36
- 37 the effective date of this act. The commission shall hold its
- first meeting before August 1, 2005. The Chairman of the House 38
- 39 Education Committee and the Chairman of the Senate Education
- Committee shall serve as cochairmen of the commission. 40
- 41 Members of the commission may not be compensated for the
- 42 performance of their duties. Any incidental costs associated with
- conducting the study shall be paid by the State Department of 43

- (5) To effectuate the purposes of this section, any 45
- department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the 46
- state or of any political subdivision thereof shall, at the 47
- 48 request of the chairperson of the task force, provide to the
- commission such facilities, assistance and data as will enable the 49

- 51 SECTION 2. (1) There is created a commission to study the
- 52 effectiveness and efficiency of the administration of college
- tuition assistance programs administered by the institutions of 53
- higher learning. In addition, the commission shall evaluate 54
- 55 merit-based college tuition assistance programs and procedures and
- 56 guidelines for implementing merit-based programs.
- The commission shall make a report of its findings and 57
- 58 recommendations to the House and Senate Education Committees by
- October 1, 2005, including any recommended legislation. 59
- 60 (2) The commission shall be composed of the following three
- (3) members: 61
- 62 A representative of the State Department of
- 63 Education, to be appointed by the State Superintendent of Public
- Education; 64
- 65 (b) A representative from the institutions of higher
- 66 learning, to be appointed by the commissioner;
- A representative from the State Board for Community 67
- 68 and Junior Colleges, to be appointed by the chairman of the board.

- (3) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after 69
- the effective date of this act. The commission shall hold its 70
- first meeting before July 15, 2005. 71
- 72 (4) Members of the commission may not be compensated for the
- performance of their duties. Any incidental costs associated with 73
- 74 conducting the study shall be paid by the State Department of
- 75 Education.
- (5) To effectuate the purposes of this section, any 76
- 77 department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of the
- state or of any political subdivision thereof shall, at the 78
- 79 request of the chairperson of the task force, provide to the
- commission such facilities, assistance and data as will enable the 80
- 81 commission to properly carry out its duties.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 82
- 83 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO CREATE A COMMISSION TO STUDY THE EFFECTIVENESS AND EFFICIENCY OF THE MISSISSIPPI ADEQUATE EDUCATION PROGRAM IN PROVIDING ADEQUACY AND EQUITY IN PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING; TO CREATE A COMMISSION TO STUDY THE EFFECTIVENESS AND EFFICIENCY OF THE ADMINISTRATION OF COLLEGE TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND EVALUATE MERIT BASED COLLEGE TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
