House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2957

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 SECTION 1. Section 63-1-49, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

63-1-49. (1) An expired license issued pursuant to this 9 article may be renewed at any time within twelve (12) months after 10 the expiration date of said license upon application and payment 11 12 of the required fee, and the payment of a delinquent fee of One 13 Dollar (\$1.00), in lieu of a driver examination, unless the holder of the expired license is required to be examined, or unless the 14 15 department has reason to believe the licensee is no longer 16 qualified to receive a license. If any person shall obtain a new 17 license, his last previous license having been good and valid, 18 except for its lapsing, without his having obtained a renewal 19 within the time required by law, then such reissuance of a license 20 shall constitute a renewal of the previous license and not a new 21 license.

22 Any person in the armed services of the United (2)(a) States, holding a valid license issued pursuant to this article 23 and being out of state due to military service at the time the 24 license expires, may renew the license by mail or by on-line 25 26 renewal services or at any time within ninety (90) days after 27 being discharged from such military service or upon returning to the state, without payment of any delinquent fee or examination, 28 29 unless the department has reason to believe that the licensee is 30 no longer qualified to receive a license. Such person shall make proof by affidavit of the fact of such military service and of the 31 32 time of discharge or return. The expiration of the license of a

33 military person under the provisions of this paragraph (a) shall 34 not affect the validity of the license, but such license shall 35 continue to be valid and permit such person to operate a motor 36 vehicle for a period of ninety (90) days after he is discharged 37 from military service or returns to the state or until he renews 38 his license, whichever event first occurs.

39 (b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this subsection 40 (2) also apply to a dependent of a person in the armed services of the United States who is out of state due to military service if 41 the dependent resides out of state with the armed services member 42 43 and the license of the dependent expires during his or her absence from the state. The Commissioner of Public Safety may adopt such 44 45 rules and regulations as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this paragraph. 46

(3) Any person holding a valid license issued pursuant to this article who is going overseas for two (2) to four (4) years and whose license shall expire during the stay overseas may renew said license for four (4) years prior to leaving. Said person shall make proof by affidavit of the fact of such overseas travel. Such reissuance of a license shall constitute a renewal of the previous license and not a new license.

54 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 and after July 1, 2005.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-49, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE THAT MILITARY PERSONNEL AND THEIR DEPENDENTS THAT ARE OUT 3 OF STATE DUE TO MILITARY SERVICE MAY RENEW THEIR EXPIRED DRIVER'S 4 LICENSES BY MAIL OR BY ON-LINE RENEWAL SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES.
