## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

170	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the	intention of
171	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's respo	nsibility to
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172 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 173 Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 174 175 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 176 177 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 178 179 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 180 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 181 182 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 183 184 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 185 186 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 187 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 188 189 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 190 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 191

192 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 193 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 194 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 195 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 196 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 197 198 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 199 200 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

205 **SECTION 4.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 206 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 207 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 208 209 intended mission of this agency. A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2007.

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Corrections may use any federal funds that may become available for the construction of a certified fail-safe lethal/nonlethal fencing system at any of its maximum security units for that purpose.

The department of its contracted medical provider 252 SECTION 6. will pay to a provider of a medical service for any and all 253 254 incarcerated persons from a correctional or detention facility an 255 amount no greater than the reimbursement rate applicable based on 256 the Mississippi Medicaid reimbursement rate. This limitation 257 applies to all medical care services, durable and nondurable goods, prescription drugs and medications provided to any and all 258 259 incarcerated persons outside of the correctional or detention 260 facility.

261 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 262 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the 263 jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the 264 department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of 265 fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities 266 furnished to said housing. The Department of Corrections shall 267 not pay for the installation or monthly service of any telephone 268 installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction.

SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney General.

SECTION 9. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles 277 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the 278 Governor in each specific case.

279 SECTION 10. None of the money herein appropriated shall be 280 paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an 281 282 employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State 283 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually 284 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance 285 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General 286 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of 287 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 288 289 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated. 290 In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above 291 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive 292 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin 293 294 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi 295 Department of Corrections.

296 **SECTION 11.** It is the intent of the Legislature that all 297 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per 298 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those 299 incarcerated in maximum security.

300 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 301 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept, 302 budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise 303 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the 304 purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for 305 use within the department.

306 **SECTION 13.** None of the funds appropriated herein can be 307 directly or indirectly associated with the ACA accreditation in 308 the Community Services Division.

309 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 310 per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed 311 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate. All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.

317 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections may 318 319 transfer between certain budgets authorized in Section 3, 320 including Support, Medical Services, Parole Board, Farming Operations, Private Prisons and Local Confinement and Regional 321 322 Facilities, both positions and funds in an amount not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets in the 323 aggregate. The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of 324 325 Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and 326 327 Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer. However, no transfers shall 328 329 be authorized which increase the major object of expenditure 330 "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits" in any budget authorized in Section 3 of this act. 331

SECTION 16. 332 It is the intention of the Legislature that the 333 Mississippi Department of Corrections may use funds appropriated 334 herein to enter into a lease purchase agreement to purchase 335 property located at 421 West Pascagoula Street in Jackson, 336 Mississippi, for use as the Hinds County Probation and Parole 337 Office and the Statewide Records Office for the Mississippi 338 Department of Corrections. Total outlays for any such agreement to purchase this facility must be less than the total outlays to 339 340 lease this property over a ten-year period and shall be approved 341 by the Executive Director of the Department of Finance and 342 Administration.

343 **SECTION 17.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 344 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept, 345 budget and expend any portion of confiscated funds received in 346 conjunction with its participating in investigations of illegal

S. B. 3076 PAGE 10 347 activities of any offender under the supervision of the agency.
348 These funds shall be used to provide security enhancement within
349 the Department of Corrections.

350 SECTION 18. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 351 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 352 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 353 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 354 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 355 356 SECTION 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from 357 and after July 1, 2005.
