## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

31 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 32 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 33 34 Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 35 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 36 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the 37 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 38 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 39 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 40 41 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 42 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 43 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 44 45 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 46 Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 47 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 48 49 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 50 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 51 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 52 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 53 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 54 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 55 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 56 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 57 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 58 59 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 60 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 61 appropriated level. 62 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be

used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this

act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

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SECTION 3. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 66 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 67 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 68 69 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 70 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 71 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005.
