Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Senate Bill No. 2861

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7 amended as follows:

8 49-7-13. (1) Any resident of the state sixteen (16) years 9 of age or older, upon application, is entitled to receive a state 10 trapper's license with tag for the sum of Twenty-five Dollars 11 (\$25.00), together with the fee provided in Section 49-7-17 to the 12 officer issuing same. This license shall be required of each 13 helper or assistant sixteen (16) years of age or older employed or 14 used by a trapper.

15 (2) No person shall trap or set a trap on lands in which the 16 record title is vested in another person unless he has a prior 17 agreement with the landowner which allows him to trap or set a 18 trap on the lands of the landowner.

19 (3) Every trap shall have an identification number attached 20 to traps by a metal tag or permanently inscribed, etched or 21 stamped on traps and every trapper shall be required to visit his 22 traps at least every thirty-six (36) hours. The conservation 23 officer shall be authorized to take up any traps not properly 24 marked.

(4) No person shall place or set a trap on or within one
hundred (100) feet of any street or public road. Public roads
shall not be construed to mean public waterways.

(5) This section shall not apply to a landowner trapping onhis own lands except subsection (4).

30 A licensed trapper shall be allowed to catch and sell (6) skins of fur-bearing and predatory animals during trapping season. 31 A licensed trapper shall be allowed to sell skins or pelts of 32 legally acquired furbearing and predatory animals to any 33 Mississippi-licensed fur dealer for ten (10) days beyond the close 34 35 of trapping season. The meat of legally acquired raccoons, muskrats and opossums may also be bought and sold during trapping 36 37 season and ten (10) days thereafter.

38 SECTION 2. Section 49-7-65, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 39 amended as follows:

40 49-7-65. Except as provided in this chapter, it is unlawful for any person to hunt, trap, take, kill, wound or capture, or 41 42 attempt to hunt, trap, take, kill, wound or capture any fur-bearing animals * * * except during the open season prescribed 43 44 by law or regulation, or to have in his possession the green pelt of any such animal except during the open season and ten (10) days 45 46 after the close of the open season. However, mink may be hunted 47 with dogs during the season for taking of fur-bearing animals on payment of trapper's license fee by person so hunting mink with 48 49 dogs.

50 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 51 and after July 1, 2005.
