## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and 8 Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, Plant Industry and 9 10 Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006.....\$ 11 7,221,410.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special 13 14 source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available 15 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support 16 and Plant Industry and Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year 17 beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... 18 \$ 4,988,874.00. 19 20 The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 21 this section include subscription fees produced from the Market Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi 22 23 Agriculture and Forestry Museum.

SECTION 3. Subsidies, Loans and Grants...... 37 541,461.00 38 12,210,284.00 Total.....\$ FUNDING: 39 40 General Funds.....\$ 7,221,410.00 41 Special Funds..... 4,988,874.00 12,210,284.00 42 Total.....\$ 43 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: Full Time..... 195 44 Permanent: Part Time..... 45 2 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 46 18 0 47 Part Time..... 48 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 49 50 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 51 52 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the 53 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 54

55 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall

56 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 57 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 58 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 59 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 60 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal 61 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 62 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 63 64 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 65 66 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 67 68 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 69

70 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 71 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 72 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 73 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 74 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 75 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 76 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 77 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the appropriated level. 78

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

83 **SECTION 4.** The funds appropriated and authorized to be 84 expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for 85 the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State 86 Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all 87 programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime

Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Quarantine 88 89 Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized to be 90 conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not 91 limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy 92 Act; the Weights and Measure Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; 93 the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following additional 94 programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law; publication and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, agricultural 95 statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; and 96 97 inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, 98 99 seed and syrup.

100 SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 101 Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish 102 103 nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for profit" activities 104 related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The 105 funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted 106 accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department 107 of Finance and Administration.

**SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that any regulations promulgated by the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce concerning the labeling of liming materials include the actual analysis of said lime. Nothing in the regulations shall prevent any manufacturer from selling his products to any consumer as long as the labeling is accurate.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce is hereby authorized to accept, budget and expend funds from any source in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 120 121 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 122 Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any 123 other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control 124 Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the 125 support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... 126 127 499,999.00.

Of the special funds authorized in this section, Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from funds received from the Mississippi Department of Transportation and Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from counties and from fees charged private persons/organizations.

SECTION 9. Of the funds provided by the provisions of this 133 act, it is the intent of the Legislature that not more than Thirty 134 135 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be expended for the Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program, which 136 137 shall be established by the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce to serve senior citizens above sixty (60) years of age 138 139 who fall within one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the poverty The Commissioner of Agriculture may promulgate rules and 140 level. 141 regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program. 142

143 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 144 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 145 146 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 147 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 148 149 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from 150 and after July 1, 2005.
