## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill No. 887

## **BY: Committee**

## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. (1) When hunting deer during any gun season on 10 deer, a hunter must wear in full view at least five hundred (500) 11 square inches of solid unbroken fluorescent orange. This 12 13 requirement shall not apply to a hunter while the hunter is in a fully enclosed deer stand. 14 15 (2) A violation of this section is a Class II violation and is punishable as provided in Section 49-7-143. 16 17 SECTION 2. The open season for game birds shall be as follows: 18 (a) On bobwhite quail: The season shall open on 19 20 Thanksgiving Day and run through the first Saturday in March next following. 21 22 (b) On pheasant: There shall be no open season on 23 pheasant. On wild turkey: The commission may fix the spring 24 (C) 25 season between March 1 and May 15. In addition, the commission 26 may fix special fall either-sex seasons.

27 (d) On migratory birds: The open season for migratory
28 birds shall be the season prescribed by the Federal Migratory Bird
29 Treaty regulations.

30 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The open season on game animals except deer shall
31 be as follows:

(a) On squirrel:

33 (i) Zone 1: For areas north of Highway 82 plus
34 those portions of Sunflower County and Washington County south of
35 Highway 82 the season shall open on the Saturday nearest October 1
36 and run through February 28.

37 (ii) Zone 2: For areas between Highway 82 and
38 Highway 84, plus such portions of the state south of Highway 84
39 and west of Interstate 55, the season shall open on the Saturday
40 nearest October 15 and run through February 28.

41 (iii) Zone 3: For areas south of Highway 84 and
42 east of Interstate 55 the season shall open on the last Saturday
43 in October and run through February 28.

(b) On rabbits: The season shall open on the Saturday
nearest October 15 and run through February 28 next following, and
when rabbits are depredating or destroying crops, the owner of the
crops or his tenants may shoot the rabbits with guns.

48 **SECTION 4.** Section 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 49 amended as follows:

 49-7-31. (1) The open season \* \* \* on deer shall be as

 follows:

53 <u>(a)</u> With bow and arrow: October 1 through the Friday 54 prior to Thanksgiving.

55 (b) With guns and with dogs: From the Saturday prior 56 to Thanksgiving through December 1.

57 <u>(c)</u> With primitive weapons and without dogs: December 58 2 through December 15. 59 (d) With guns and without dogs: December 16 through 60 December 23. However, the commission may allow hunting statewide 61 or in specific areas with any legal weapon which it may designate 62 without dogs after the end of the last season for hunting deer 63 with guns and with dogs, but the season with legal designated 64 weapons and without dogs shall not extend beyond January 31. 65 (e) The commission shall establish an extended season

66 with primitive weapons and bow and arrow without dogs from 67 February 1 through February 15 for the area south of U.S. Highway 68 84 and east of Mississippi Highway 35 only for antlered deer with 69 a minimum inside spread of ten (10) inches or a minimum main beam 70 length of thirteen (13) inches. The commission may delay the 71 opening date and change the length of bow and arrow season in 72 paragraph (1)(a) in this area.

73 (f) With guns and with dogs: December 24 through a 74 date fixed by the commission that will provide a total of 75 thirty-nine (39) days of hunting deer with guns and with dogs when 76 added to the number of days provided for hunting deer with guns 77 and with dogs in paragraph (b).

78 \* \* \*

79 (2) \* \* \* The commission may \* \* \* set and regulate the deer 80 seasons on wildlife management areas which it administers. 81 (3) (a) The commission may allow the harvesting of 82 antlerless deer in the districts or zones upon the recommendation 83 of the executive director based upon good and substantial 84 quantitative data and research evaluations that demonstrate that 85 the harvesting is necessary to properly manage the herd.

86 (b) The commission, only upon the recommendation of the 87 executive director, may allow the harvesting of antlerless deer 88 during the deer season with guns and with dogs by a majority vote 89 of the commission.

90 <u>(c)</u> Nothing in this subsection prohibits the harvesting 91 of either-sex deer by landowners or leaseholders on private lands 92 under a deer management program prescribed or approved by the 93 executive director.

94 <u>(4) The commission may</u> provide a special permit for the 95 harvesting of deer when they are depredating and destroying crops. 96 The department shall supervise the harvesting and provide for the 97 salvaging of the meat of the animals. The commission may 98 authorize the department to assist any farmer in this state, who 99 sustains crop damage by wildlife, in eradication of the problem 100 wildlife.

101 \* \* \*

102 SECTION 5. (1) The commission shall establish a special hunting season for youth under the age of sixteen (16) and for 103 104 handicapped persons in the Natchez State Park. The commission 105 shall also establish a primitive weapon season in the Natchez 106 State Park. The selection of participants in the primitive weapon 107 season shall be by public drawing from all qualified applications. 108 The commission shall set the number of permits to be issued and 109 the length of the special seasons.

110 (2) The commission may also establish a special hunting 111 season for youth and handicapped persons or a primitive weapon season as provided in this section in any other state park under 112 113 the jurisdiction of the department but shall only do so upon the 114 recommendation of the staff of the department as approved by the commission. The commission shall select participants and set the 115 116 number of permits to be issued and the length of the special 117 seasons.

(3) The commission may establish and regulate special youth hunts for all nonmigratory game birds and animals outside of the open season on wildlife management areas and on private lands.

121 <u>SECTION 6.</u> (1) The commission may fix the open season on 122 fur-bearing animals between November 1 and March 1 next following 123 and fix the open season for hunting opossums, raccoons and bobcats 124 with dogs and guns by licensed hunters from October 1 to February 125 28 next following; but raccoons and bobcats may be run, hunted, 126 chased or pursued throughout the year with dogs by licensed 127 hunters.

128 (2) The commission may establish an additional open season 129 on raccoon from July 1 through October 1, and the bag limit on 130 raccoon during the additional open season shall be one (1) per 131 party, per night.

132 <u>SECTION 7.</u> (1) (a) The hunting of predatory animals shall 133 be restricted to the open seasons for hunting any game animal or 134 game bird, using only the firearms, ammunition, primitive weapons 135 or archery equipment legal for use during that open season.

(b) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
designated agents may take predatory animals year-round on lands
owned or leased by them.

(2) The taking of any animal or animals other than beavers, nutria or coyote by the use of a trap or traps is unlawful except during the time the season is open for the taking of fur-bearing animals.

143 (3) Fox and coyote may be run, chased or pursued with dogs
144 except as provided in Section 49-7-32 year-round by licensed
145 hunters.

146 (4) It is unlawful to trap fox after the closed season for
147 trapping of other fur-bearing animals, except on property owned or
148 leased by the person trapping.

149 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 150 and after July 1, 2005.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT TO REVISE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR WEARING HUNTER ORANGE; 2 TO PROVIDE A PENALTY FOR NOT WEARING HUNTER ORANGE; TO RECODIFY 3 OPEN SEASON LAWS ON GAME ANIMALS AND BIRDS, FUR-BEARING ANIMALS 4 AND PREDATORS; TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 5 TO CONFORM; TO FURTHER AMEND 49-7-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 6 PROVIDE FOR AN EXTENDED DEER SEASON ON BUCKS WITH CERTAIN MINIMUM 7 ANTLER SIZES IN CERTAIN COUNTIES IN SOUTH MISSISSIPPI; AND FOR 8 RELATED PURPOSES.
