## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## House Bill No. 1093

## **BY: Committee**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 SECTION 1. Section 73-21-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 73-21-85. (1) To obtain a license to engage in the practice 9 10 of pharmacy by examination, or by score transfer, the applicant shall: 11 (a) Have submitted a written application on the form 12 prescribed by the board; 13 Be of good moral character; 14 (b) Have graduated from a school or college of pharmacy 15 (C) accredited by the American Council of Pharmaceutical Education and 16 17 have been granted a pharmacy degree therefrom; (d) Have successfully passed an examination approved by 18 the board; 19 20 (e) Have paid all fees specified by the board for examination, not to exceed the cost to the board of administering 21

(f) Have paid all fees specified by the board for

the examination;

- 25 (g) Have submitted evidence of externship and/or
- 26 internship as specified by the board.
- 27 (2) To obtain a license to engage in the practice of
- 28 pharmacy, a foreign pharmacy graduate applicant shall obtain the
- 29 National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Foreign Pharmacy
- 30 Graduate Examination Committee's certification, which shall
- 31 include, but not be limited to, successfully passing the Foreign
- 32 Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination and attaining a total
- 33 score of at least five hundred fifty (550) on the Test of English
- 34 as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), and shall:
- 35 (a) Have submitted a written application on the form
- 36 prescribed by the board;
- 37 (b) Be of good moral character;
- 38 (c) Have graduated and been granted a pharmacy degree
- 39 from a college or school of pharmacy recognized and approved by
- 40 the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy's Foreign Pharmacy
- 41 Graduate Examination Committee;
- 42 (d) Have paid all fees specified by the board for
- 43 examination, not to exceed the cost to the board of administering
- 44 the examination;
- (e) Have successfully passed an examination approved by
- 46 the board;
- 47 (f) Have completed the number of internship hours as
- 48 set forth by regulations of the board; and
- 49 (g) Have paid all fees specified by the board for
- 50 licensure.
- 51 (3) Each application or filing made under this section shall
- 52 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
- 53 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 54 (4) To insure that all applicants are of good moral
- 55 character, the board shall conduct a criminal history record
- 56 background check of all applicants for a license.

- 57 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-21-111, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 58 amended as follows:
- 59 73-21-111. (1) The board shall make, adopt, amend and
- 60 repeal from time to time such rules and regulations for the
- 61 regulation of supportive personnel as may be deemed necessary by
- 62 the board.
- 63 (2) Every person who acts or serves as a pharmacy technician
- 64 in a pharmacy that is located in this state and permitted by the
- 65 board shall obtain a registration from the board. To obtain a
- 66 pharmacy technician registration the applicant must:
- 67 (a) Have submitted a written application on a form(s)
- 68 prescribed by the board; and
- (b) Be of good moral character; and
- 70 (c) Have paid the initial registration fee not to
- 71 exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).
- 72 (3) Each pharmacy technician shall renew his or her
- 73 registration annually. To renew his or her registration, a
- 74 technician must:
- 75 (a) Submit an application on a form prescribed by the
- 76 board; and
- 77 (b) Pay a renewal fee not to exceed One Hundred Dollars
- 78 (\$100.00) for each annual registration period. The board may add
- 79 a surcharge of not more than Five Dollars (\$5.00) to the
- 80 registration renewal fee to assist in funding a program that
- 81 assists impaired pharmacists, pharmacy students and pharmacy
- 82 technicians.
- 83 (4) To insure that all applicants are of good moral
- 84 character, the board shall conduct a criminal history record
- 85 background check of all applicants for registration.
- 86 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 87 and after July 1, 2005.

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-21-85 AND 73-21-111, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THAT THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY CONDUCT CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD BACKGROUND CHECKS ON ANY APPLICANT FOR PHARMACY LICENSURE AND ANY APPLICANT FOR PHARMACY TECHNICIAN REGISTRATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
