Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
10	\$ 19,189,293.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
18	\$ 8,065,954.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth

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improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of 24 the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby, 25 Columbia Training School and colleges and universities. 26 27 Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall 28 pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work. Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into 29 30 the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund." 31

32 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 33 Section 1 and Section 2, not more than the amounts set forth below 34 shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 35 expenditure:

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With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 56 57 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 58 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 59 Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 60 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 61 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the 62 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 63 64 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 65 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 66 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 67 68 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 69 70 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 71 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 72 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this 73 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 74 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 75 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 76 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 77 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

78 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 79 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 80 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 81 82 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 83 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 84 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 85 86 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

91 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 92 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 93 94 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 95 2005. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 96 97 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 98 99 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 100 during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process.

SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 134 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 135 136 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated 137 138 from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount 139 not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00). 140 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 141 Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with 142 143 funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred 144 145 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these funds is hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts and 146 expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in 147 148 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et 149 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

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SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 150 151 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed 152 153 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of 154 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the 155 156 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used 157 158 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day. 159 160 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written 161 162 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal 163 Officer.

164 **SECTION 8.** The Forestry Commission has the authority to 165 purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter 166 Catalog and any other GSA Catalog as long as the cost of such 167 items are less than the quotes received.

168 SECTION 9. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 169 fund designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry 170 171 Commission to assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal 172 173 Property Program or by Volunteer Fire Departments through other 174 means to adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. This assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks 175 176 or other accessories necessary for the operation of fire suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or 177 other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire 178 suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle 179 180 maintenance or repair.

181 The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving 182 Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and 183 services performed for Volunteer Fire Departments by the State 184 Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be 185 deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion 186 Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements 187 therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of 188 189 warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

197 SECTION 10. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a 198 fund designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be 199 used by the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management 200 activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County, 201 Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but 202 not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities 203 and regeneration work.

The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by 204 205 monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source. Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into 206 207 the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall 208 make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies 209 and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of 210 211 Finance and Administration.

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It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future years.

218 SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 219 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 220 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 221 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 222 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 223 SECTION 12. This act shall take effect and be in force from 224 225 and after July 1, 2005.
