## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## House Bill No. 1657

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
10	\$ 8,703,714.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
18	\$ 36,209,037.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006 \$ 5,750,000.00.

- The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the 24 25 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and 26 27 other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside 28 from such funds before making distribution thereof. However, 29 provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund, as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and 30 any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 31
- Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be 33 34 expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to 35 36 the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage 37 funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
- Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the 39 amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred 40 41 Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 42 43 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of

170	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
171	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
172	Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006
173	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
174	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the
175	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
176	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
177	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
178	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
179	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
180	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
181	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal
182	Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
183	If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal

Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 184 185 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 186 187 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 188 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 189 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 190 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 191 192 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 193 194 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 195 196 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 197 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 198 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 199 appropriated level. No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 200 201 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 202 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 203 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 204 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 205 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain 206 complete accounting and personnel records related to the 207 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 208 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as 209 maintained for Fiscal Year 2005. It is further the intention of 210 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 211 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 212 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request 213

process.

- 285 Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for
- 286 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
- 287 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
- It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
- 289 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
- 290 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 291 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 292 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 293 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not
- 294 to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), that may become
- 295 available to the department in accordance with the rules and
- 296 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 297 **SECTION 13.** In order to be in compliance with Sections
- 298 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be
- 299 expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay
- 300 the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees
- 301 and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the
- 302 course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold
- 303 a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
- 304 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 305 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
- 306 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi
- 307 Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars
- 308 (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi
- 309 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of
- 310 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.

- 311 SECTION 15. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
- 312 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
- 313 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into
- 314 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 315 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.
- The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
- 317 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
- 318 Parks for this purpose.
- 319 **SECTION 16.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 320 Commission of the Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall
- 321 have the authority to close, transfer, lease or sell properties
- 322 under the department's jurisdiction.
- 323 **SECTION 17.** The department is authorized to spend up to
- 324 twenty-five percent (25%) of revenue in the State Park Timber
- 325 Endowment Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state
- 326 parks.
- 327 **SECTION 18.** As funds become available to the department, an
- 328 amount equal to One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 329 (\$1,500,000.00) may be used for completion of the North
- 330 Mississippi Fish Hatchery and any repair of levies or dams as
- 331 deemed necessary by the department.
- 332 **SECTION 19.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no
- 333 more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) be
- 334 spent from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the purchase of motor
- 335 vehicles.
- 336 **SECTION 20.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 337 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 338 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 339 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 340 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 341 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

342 **SECTION 21.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005.
