HOUSE BILL NO. 48

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 1 THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI AUCTIONEERS COMMISSION FOR THE 2 3 FISCAL YEAR 2006. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Auctioneers Commission 7 8 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006. 9 \$ 98,999.00. 10 SECTION 2. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 11 12 of Section 1, the following positions are authorized: 13 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: Full Time..... 14 Permanent: 1 15 Part Time..... 0 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 16 0 Part Time..... 17 0 18 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 19 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 20 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 21 Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 22 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the 23 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 24 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 25 26 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 27

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It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 28 act. 29 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 30 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 31 32 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 33 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 34 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 35 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 36 37 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 38 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 39

40 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 41 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 42 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 43 44 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 45 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 46 47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 48 appropriated level.

49 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 50 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 51 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 52 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 53 54 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 55 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 56 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 57 58 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 59 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 60 *HR05/A828*

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Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 61 62 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement 63 of a departing employee with an individual from within state 64 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 65 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 66 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 67 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise authorized in this act. 68

69 Of the above funds, none may be expended by this act to 70 provide for any regulatory authority over livestock auctioneers 71 conducting sales for an individual of his own property.

72 SECTION 3. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 73 Mississippi Auctioneers Commission shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 74 75 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 76 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2005. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 77 78 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 79 80 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process. 81

82 SECTION 4. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 83 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 84 85 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 86 87 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from 88 89 and after July 1, 2005.
