1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2006.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006
10	\$ 1,723,977.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Marine Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and
15	ending June 30, 2006\$ 8,105,380.00.
16	Of the funds appropriated in this section, Three Million
17	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,050,000.00) is derived from the state
18	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products.
19	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions
20	of Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below
21	shall be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
22	expenditure:

43	Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor shall be
44	furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Four Hundred
45	Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) per annum.
46	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
47	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
48	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
49	Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006
50	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
51	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the
52	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
53	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
54	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
55	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
56	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure

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Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
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    has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
    projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services"
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    appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
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    reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
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    requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
    such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
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         Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
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    the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
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    allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
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    Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
    approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.
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    Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
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    approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
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    without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
    appropriated level.
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         No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
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    used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
    being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
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    act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
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         The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise
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    award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,
    realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other
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    means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless
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    specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of
    teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the
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    next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an
    educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public
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    Accountant License or higher level professional certification as
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    determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement
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    of a departing employee with an individual from within state
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    service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the
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    departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses,
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94 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 95 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 96 authorized in this act. 97 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 98 Department of Marine Resources shall maintain complete accounting 99 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 100 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 101 102 2005. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be submitted to 103 104 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 105 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 106 during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process. 107 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Marine Resources shall have the authority to 108 109 receive, budget and expend funds from any source that may become 110 available to the department in accordance with the rules and 111 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds. 112 113 SECTION 6. 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     section shall be held responsible for complying with Section
     29-15-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, and shall be subject to an
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     audit by the State Auditor and shall submit detailed reports
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     beginning June 30, and every six (6) months thereafter for the
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     duration of the project to the Department of Marine Resources on
     how funds authorized in this section were expended.
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          It is the intention of the Legislature that any political
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     subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the
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     subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department
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     of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2005. All proposals
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     submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of

     Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures.
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     Multiphased projects, multiyear projects, proposed projects with
     high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking
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     funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated.
          It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of
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     the tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual
     amount of tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be
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     allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this
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     section, except for the Deer Island Payment.
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          It is the intention of the Legislature that the tidelands
     funds appropriated in this act for Tidelands Project No. FY06-M19A
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     Federal Grant Matching Funds - Mississippi Coastal Habitat
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     Creation and Restoration and Tidelands Project No. FY06-M19A
     Federal Grant Matching Funds - Grand Bay NERR Construction be
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     reallocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this
     section if the federal funds are not awarded for these two (2)

     projects.
          SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
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     necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State
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     Treasury to the credit of the Department of Marine Resources,
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tidelands fund, which is comprised of special source funds

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available to the department, for expenditures pursuant to House
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     Bill No. 1733, 2004 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning
     July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006...... $6,600,000.00
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          SECTION 8.
                      It is the intention of the Legislature that the
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     commission shall place any special trust funds appropriated to the
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     department in a special trust fund and the interest earned on the
     principal shall be credited to the special trust fund. Monies in
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     the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the
     special trust fund for use in the next succeeding fiscal year.
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     The department may use the interest earned on the fund to pay
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     reasonable costs for administering the fund and related projects.
          SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that
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     tidelands funds not otherwise appropriated shall be used for
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     additional funding of tideland projects and the administration
     thereof by the Department of Marine Resources. Expenditures of
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     excess tidelands funds by the Department of Marine Resources for
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     supplemental and additional funding and administration of
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     tidelands projects heretofore or hereafter proposed is authorized
     and approved. The Department of Marine Resources may escalate the
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     Tidelands Fund in an amount not to exceed Eight Hundred Thousand
     Dollars ($800,000.00) for the purposes outlined in this section.
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          It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of
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     Marine Resources be allowed to make necessary transfers from the
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     Subsidies, Loans and Grants category of expenditures to any other
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     categories of expenditures for the purpose of expending tidelands
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     funds.
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          SECTION 10.
                       It is the intention of the Legislature that the
     Department of Marine Resources has the authorization to move
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     tidelands funds between approved projects upon request from entity
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     and proper completion of Form TTF-6 documentation.
          SECTION 11. Of the funds provided herein, the sum of Three
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     Hundred Six Thousand One Hundred Eighty-five Dollars ($306,185.00)
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is hereby assessed on any nonfederal special funds and shall be

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258	deposited to the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section
259	27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, on or before October 1,
260	2005, for the purpose of reimbursing the State of Mississippi for

262	SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
263	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

266	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
