9	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
10	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
11	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
12	Rehabilitation Services which is comprised of special source funds
13	collected by or otherwise available to the department for the
14	support of the various offices of the department, for the purpose
15	of defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year
16	beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006

Based on data provided by the 171 172 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 173 174 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 175 176 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 177 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 178 179 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 180 Services, " the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 181 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 182 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 183 184 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 185 186 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 187 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 188 189 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 190 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 191 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 192 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written \*HR05/A330. 1\* H. 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193 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 194 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 195 appropriated level. 196 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 197 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 198 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 199 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 200 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 201 202 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 203 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 204 205 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 206 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 207 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 208 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 209 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement 210 of a departing employee with an individual from within state service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 211 212 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 213 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 214 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise authorized in this act. 215 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive 216 217 Director of the Department of Rehabilitation Services may transfer between the various offices authorized herein both funds and 218 219 positions not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the receiving 220 office in addition to any other transfers or escalations made in accordance with Section 27-104-17(3), Mississippi Code of 1972, 221 222 Annotated. The Executive Director of the Department of 223 Rehabilitation Services shall submit written justification for the 224 transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of

Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month

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prior to the effective date of the transfer. It is further the
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     intention of the Legislature that any transfers made under the
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     provisions of this paragraph shall be of an emergency nature and
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     that in no case shall the transfers be made which substantially
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     alter the legislative intent for the various offices as set forth
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     in the original appropriations made under this act.
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          SECTION 5. In addition to all other sums herein
     appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
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     necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds which are
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     received by or otherwise become available to the Mississippi

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          SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
     Department of Rehabilitation Services shall maintain complete
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     accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
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     funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
     in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
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     Year 2005. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
     the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be
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     submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
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     and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
     provided during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process.
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          SECTION 7.
                      It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or
     other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of
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     any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
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     Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for
     any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of
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     Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
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          It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
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     authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply

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259	SECTION 8. Of the funds in Sections 1, 2 and 3, the
260	Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services through the
261	Office of Vocational Rehabilitation for the Blind is authorized to
262	expend an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars
263	(\$100,000.00) for the National Federation for the Blind (NFB) News
264	line service to allow blind and visually impaired persons to
265	access newspapers through toll-free telephone calls.
266	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated herein within this act
267	the following amount of Two Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
268	(\$2,500,000.00) shall be derived from Treasury Fund No. 3332 for

270	SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by

274	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
