HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 7

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIVES AND VALOR OF THE YALOBUSHA
2 COUNTY VETERANS, DECEASED SINCE JANUARY 2004, AND EXPRESSING
3 DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO THEIR FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON THEIR PASSING.

5 Yalobusha and the State of Mississippi have laid to rest many of
6 its valiant native sons, veterans who stood with a heart of
7 courage in the line of fire and braved the trenches during wars in
