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SENATE BILL NO. 2005

AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI MILITARY FAMILY RELIEF FUND; TO PROVIDE THAT MONEY IN THE FUND SHALL BE UTILIZED TO MAKE GRANTS 3 TO FAMILIES THAT EXPERIENCE A FINANCIAL HARDSHIP AS A RESULT OF A 4 FAMILY MEMBER WHO IS A MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT AND WHO IS A MEMBER OF 5 THE MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD OR THE RESERVES OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES BEING CALLED TO ACTIVE DUTY AS A RESULT OF б THE SEPTEMBER 11, 2001, TERRORIST ATTACKS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE ADJUTANT GENERAL SHALL ESTABLISH ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR 7 8 RECEIPT OF THE GRANTS AND THE AMOUNT OF THE GRANTS BY RULE; TO AUTHORIZE RESIDENT INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAXPAYERS TO DESIGNATE ANY 9 10 PORTION OF THEIR TAX REFUND FOR DEPOSIT INTO THE MISSISSIPPI 11 12 MILITARY FAMILY RELIEF FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 33-3-11, MISSISSIPPI 13 CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 SECTION 1. (1) A special fund to be designated the 16 "Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund," is created in the State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State Treasurer as 17 a separate and special fund, separate and apart from the General 18 19 Fund of the state. The fund shall consist of any money designated for deposit therein from any source, including, but not limited 20 21 to, money designated for deposit therein by Section 2, Senate Bill 22 No. 2005, 2005 Second Extraordinary Session, and private 23 contributions. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the 24 end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund and any interest earned or investment earnings on amounts in the 25 fund shall be deposited into the fund. Money in the fund shall be 26 under the direction of the Military Department. Such funds shall 27 be paid by the State Treasurer upon warrants issued by the 28 29 Department of Finance and Administration, based upon 30 recommendations made by the Adjutant General. Money in the fund

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31 shall be utilized to make grants to families that experience a
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- 32 financial hardship as a result of a family member who is a
- 33 Mississippi resident and a member of the Mississippi National
- 34 Guard or the Reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States
- 35 being called to active duty as a result of the September 11, 2001,
- 36 terrorist attacks. The Adjutant General shall establish
- 37 eligibility requirements for receipt of the grants and the amount
- 38 of the grants by rule.
- 39 (2) This section shall stand repealed from and after January
- 40 1, 2008.
- 41 **SECTION 2.** (1) Each resident individual taxpayer who files
- 42 a Mississippi income tax return and who will receive a tax refund
- 43 from the State Tax Commission may designate that a contribution be
- 44 made to the Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund created in
- 45 Section 1, Senate Bill No. 2005, 2005 Second Extraordinary
- 46 Session, to authorize resident individual income taxpayers to
- 47 designate any portion of their tax refund for deposit into the
- 48 Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund by marking the appropriate
- 49 box printed on the return pursuant to this subsection. In the
- 50 case of a joint return, each spouse may designate that a portion
- of the refund shall be paid to such fund.
- The State Tax Commission shall print on the Mississippi
- 53 income tax form for residents a space for designating the
- 54 contribution in substantially the following form:
- 55 "Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund
- I wish to contribute () \$1 () \$5 () \$10 () Other \$____
- 57 of my tax refund to the Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund."
- 58 (2) The State Tax Commission shall explain in the
- 59 instructions accompanying the individual income tax form the
- 60 purposes for which the contributions authorized herein shall be
- 61 used.
- 62 (3) This section shall apply to taxable years beginning on
- 63 or after January 1, 2005.
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- 64 (4) The Chairman of the State Tax Commission shall determine
- 65 annually the total amount designated by individuals to be paid to
- 66 the fund, along with all interest earned thereon, and shall report
- 67 such amount to the State Treasurer who shall pay such amount into
- 68 the Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund.
- (5) This section shall stand repealed from and after January
- 70 1, 2008.
- 71 **SECTION 3.** Section 33-3-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 72 amended as follows:
- 73 [Through December 31, 2007, this section shall read as
- 74 follows:]
- 75 33-3-11. (1) The Adjutant General shall:
- 76 (a) Appoint all of the employees of his department and
- 77 he may remove any of them at his discretion;
- 78 (b) Keep rosters of all active, reserve and retired
- 79 members of the militia of this state, and keep in his office all
- 80 records and papers required to be kept and filed therein;
- 81 (c) Submit to the Governor in each year preceding a
- 82 regular session of the Legislature a printed detailed report of
- 83 the transactions of his office, the expenses thereof, and such
- 84 operations and conditions of the National Guard of this state as
- 85 may be required by the Governor;
- 86 (d) Cause the military law, the regulations of the
- 87 National Guard of this state and such other military publications
- 88 as may be necessary for the military service to be distributed at
- 89 the expense of the state to commands so that all personnel of the
- 90 National Guard of this state will have access to same;
- 91 (e) Keep records on and preserve all military property
- 92 belonging to the state;
- 93 (f) Keep just and true accounts of all monies received
- 94 and disbursed by him;
- 95 (g) Attest all commissions and warrants issued to
- 96 military officers of this state;

98	(i) Make such regulations pertaining to the
99	preparations of reports and returns and to the care and

L13	the unorganized militia as may be called out by the Governor;
L14	(1) Keep the reports and returns of troops and all
L15	other writings and documents required to be preserved by the state
L16	military headquarters;
L17	(m) Make rules establishing the eligibility criteria
L18	for grants from the Mississippi Military Family Relief Fund and
L19	the amount of such grants;
L20	(n) Keep necessary records attesting to the service of
L21	individuals of Mississippi forces for the Spanish American War and
L22	all subsequent wars and insurrections. The Adjutant General is
L23	authorized to make a determination as to when old records have
