L2	SECTION 2. With the funds appropriated under the provisions

L9	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
20	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to

24	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the

    of 1972, on or before October 1, 2005, for the purpose of

         SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
