SENATE BILL NO. 2036

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 1 MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FOR FISCAL YEARS 2005 AND 2006. 2 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 5 6 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the 7 expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority for the fiscal 8 year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... 9 17,511,951.00.\$ SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 10 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Development Authority or 12 the appropriate special fund for the purpose of defraying the 13 expenses incurred in the operation of the various divisions of the 14 authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending 15 June 30, 2006.....\$ 97,014,491.00. 16 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 17 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 18 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 19 20 Permanent: Full Time..... 264 Part Time..... 21 2 22 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 22 23 Part Time..... 1 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 24 25 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 26 Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 27 *SS05/A410* S. 28 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 29 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the 30 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 31 32 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 33 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 34 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 35 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal 36 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. 37 38 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 39 40 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 41 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 42 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 43 44 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 45 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 46 47 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 48 49 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 50 The 51 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 52 53 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the appropriated level. 54

55 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 56 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 57 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 58 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

59 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 60 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification,

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realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 61 62 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 63 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of 64 teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 65 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 66 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 67 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement 68 of a departing employee with an individual from within state 69 70 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 71 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 72 73 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 74 authorized in this act.

SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 116 amount of Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) shall 117 118 be provided from the Mississippi Department of Transportation to defray the expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority in 119 120 operating the state welcome centers. SECTION 6. The acceptance and expenditure of funds, and 121 122 interest on such funds, received from, or by virtue of consent or 123 other orders of or agreements involving any agency, 124 instrumentality, or judicial tribunal of any state or the United 125 States for petroleum price compliance and allocation which may 126 become available during the fiscal year for the support of the *SS05/A410* S. 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Mississippi Development Authority or any programs sponsored under the terms of the receipt of these funds are hereby authorized not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) and approved, provided such receipts and expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq., and Section 27-104-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority is hereby authorized to escalate, budget and expend funds from any source not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

139 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 140 Mississippi Development Authority shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 141 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 142 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 143 144 Year 2005. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2007 shall be 145 146 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 147 148 provided during the Fiscal Year 2006 budget request process.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 149 the amount of Six Million Four Hundred Sixty-two Thousand Dollars 150 151 (\$6,462,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 152 provided for the purpose of supporting Mississippi Tourism 153 Advertising and Promotion for Fiscal Year 2006, and shall not be 154 expended for any type of cultural exchange program. The expenditure of funds authorized in this section shall be exempt 155 156 from Section 25-9-120, Mississippi Code of 1972.

157 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 158 the amount of One Million Five Hundred Sixty-seven Thousand 159 Dollars (\$1,567,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, S. B. No. 2036 *SS05/A410*

052E/SS05/A410 PAGE 5 160 is provided for the purpose of supporting, marketing, and 161 facilitating Mississippi business growth for Fiscal Year 2006. 162 The expenditure of funds authorized in this section shall be 163 exempt from Section 25-9-120, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi Development Authority for the purpose of providing funds for Mississippi Technology Alliance, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006 \$1,150,612.00.

The funds appropriated under the provisions of this section 171 172 are provided for the specific purpose of providing state funds for support of Mississippi Technology Alliance to strengthen the 173 174 business environment in Mississippi to spur the creation and growth of technology-based industries, thus creating many more 175 high-paying jobs and a more diversified, competitive Mississippi 176 177 The funds herein appropriated shall be held separate and economy. apart from all other funds appropriated to the Mississippi 178 179 Development Authority.

180 SECTION 12. In addition to all other sums herein 181 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 182 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi 183 184 Development Authority for the purpose of providing funds to support the Enterprise for Geospatial Solutions, for the 185 186 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006... 187\$ 611,358.00. 188 The funds herein appropriated shall be held separate and apart from all other funds appropriated to the Mississippi 189 190 Development Authority. 191 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that of

192 the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, not more than Twenty
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193 Thousand (\$20,000.00) may be expended for Mississippi Development 194 Authority employee travel associated with business recruitment 195 activities conducted at the Mississippi event located in New York 196 City's Central Park.

197 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 198 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate 199 are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 200 201 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public 202 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 203 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 204 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 205 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following 206 language: "Funds were made available for this project by the 207 Mississippi State Legislature."

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972.

212 SECTION 16. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the sum of Thirty-five Million Dollars 213 214 (\$35,000,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from Mississippi Development Authority fund number 215 216 34CW in order to fulfill the state's obligation relating to the MS 217 Beef Processors, LLC, during FY 2005, with any remaining balance lapsing to the State General Fund, as authorized in House Bill 218 219 No.1 of the 2005 Second Extraordinary Session.

220 SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 221 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 222 223 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 224 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 225 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. *SS05/A410* S. 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SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005, except for Section 16 which shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
