## SENATE BILL NO. 2039

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 1 THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE, 2 3 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2006. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 8 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support, Plant Industry and 9 Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year beginning 10 July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... \$ 7,271,375.00. 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 13 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available 14 15 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support 16 and Plant Industry and Farmers Central Market, for the fiscal year 17 beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... 18 .....\$ 19 5,614,530.00. 20 The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 21 this section include subscription fees produced from the Market 22 Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi 23 Agriculture and Forestry Museum. SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 24 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 25 26 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 27 Permanent: Full Time..... 220

31 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 32 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 33 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006 34 35 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the 36 37 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 38 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 39 40 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 41 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. 42 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal 43 44 Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds. If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 45 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 46 47 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services" 48 49 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 50 51 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 52 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

66 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 67 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other 68 69 means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 70 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 71 72 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 73 74 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement 75 76 of a departing employee with an individual from within state 77 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 78 79 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 80 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 81 authorized in this act.

SECTION 4. The funds appropriated and authorized to be 82 83 expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for 84 the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all 85 86 programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime 87 Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Quarantine Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized to be 88 conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not 89 90 limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy 91 Act; the Weights and Measure Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; 92 the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following additional \*SS05/A401\* S. 93 programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law; publication 94 and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, agricultural 95 statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; and 96 inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, 97 grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, 98 seed and syrup.

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 99 SECTION 5. Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and 100 101 the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for profit" activities 102 103 related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted 104 105 accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department 106 of Finance and Administration.

107 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 108 State Department of Agriculture and Commerce is hereby authorized 109 to accept, budget and expend funds from any source in accordance 110 with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 111 Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of 112 federal funds.

113 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 114 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any 115 other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control 116 117 Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year 118 119 beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... 120 .....\$ 700,000.00.

Of the special funds authorized in this section, Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from funds received from the Mississippi Department of Transportation and Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be derived from counties and from fees charged private persons/organizations, and S. SECTION 8. Upon the passage of Senate Bill 2681, 2005 Regular Session, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from special source funds for the upgrade and operation of the State Seed Testing Laboratory for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006.....\$ 140,000.00

The special funds appropriated in this section shall be expended in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds for the purpose of defraying costs of up to three (3) permanent positions and associated expenses of operating the State Seed Testing Laboratory.

SECTION 9. Of the funds provided by the provisions of this 140 act, it is the intent of the Legislature that not more than Thirty 141 142 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be expended for the 143 Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program, which shall be established by the State Department of Agriculture and 144 145 Commerce to serve senior citizens above sixty (60) years of age who fall within one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the poverty 146 147 level. The Commissioner of Agriculture may promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Senior Farmers' 148 149 Market Nutrition Pilot Program.

150 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated herein, not more than 151 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is provided, for the 152 purpose of making incentive payments to producers of ethanol 153 utilizing Mississippi-produced agriculture commodities under the 154 provisions of Section 69-51-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of defraying S. B. No. 2039 \*SS05/A401\* 052E/SS05/A401 PAGE 5 159 the expenses of the operation of the State Department of 160 Agriculture.

SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 161 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 162 163 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 164 165 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 166 SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from 167 and after July 1, 2005. 168
