## SENATE BILL NO. 2050

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AID AND SUPPORT OF THE 1 PUBLIC COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI 2 3 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid and support 7 8 of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... 9 79,767,321.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 13 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, not otherwise 14 15 appropriated, for the aid and support of public community and 16 junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006.....\$ 31,375,725.00. 17 18 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 19 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the Budget 20 Contingency Fund, created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code 21 of 1972, for the aid and support of the public community and 22 junior colleges, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006.....\$ 23 13,279,586.00. SECTION 4. The funds appropriated in this act for the aid 24 and support of the public and community junior colleges shall be 25 26 apportioned in accordance with the following assigned weights: 27 Assigned Weight

43 In the 2/5 Head Count Formula such Academic, Technical, and Vocational funds shall be disbursed to such public community and 44 45 junior colleges on the basis of the full-time enrollment of each such public community and junior college as of the last day of the 46 47 sixth week of the fall semester, or its equivalent, of the preceding year, counting only students who reside within the State 48 49 of Mississippi. Part-time academic, vocational and technical credit courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year 50 full-time equivalency of part-time and summer students, counting 51 52 only students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

53 Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may 54 qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of 55 Virtual Community College hours generated during the summer, fall 56 and spring semesters that did not make a student full time in the 57 fall semester.

In the 3/5 FTE Formula, such Academic, Technical, Vocational, Associate Degree Nursing and Associate Degree Allied Health funds shall be disbursed on the basis of prior year full-time

No. 2050 \*SSO5/A292\* 052E/SS05/A292 PAGE 2 equivalency (FTE) of hours generated during the summer, fall and spring semesters for each public community and junior college as of the last day of the sixth week of each semester, or its equivalent, counting only students who reside within the State of Mississippi. However, associate degree nursing students who reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay purposes.

Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of Virtual Community College hours generated during the summer, fall and spring semesters. Those semester credit hours being hosted and provided by one institution shall receive funding at the weight of 1.0.

Of the funds appropriated in the act for the aid and support of the public community and junior colleges, funds up to One Million Seven Hundred Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$1,717,000.00) are provided to be set aside as a mechanism to hold harmless those colleges that lose funding in the third year of a five-year phase-in implementation period to a full-time equivalency (FTE) funding formula.

81 The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior 82 Colleges, or his designee, shall audit each public community and 83 junior college and shall determine who shall be counted in each 84 college and shall certify the number to the State Board for 85 Community and Junior Colleges.

If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at 86 87 the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the 88 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall find and 89 determine that any such public or community junior college does 90 91 not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary 92 expenses of its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2005, until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, then, in that 93 \*SS05/A292\* S. 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94 event, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges is 95 expressly authorized to make an advance to any such public 96 community or junior college or colleges not having sufficient 97 operating funds for such period from the funds appropriated 98 hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any such advance to 99 any one public community or junior college shall not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state appropriated 100 101 funds received by such public community or junior college during the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, that the amount 102 103 of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of 104 the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public community or 105 junior college when enrollment has been ascertained and 106 distribution of funds is made.

107 SECTION 5. No part of the amount herein appropriated shall 108 be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for 109 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the 110 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the 111 expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

112 **SECTION 6.** The funds disbursed under the provisions of this 113 act shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community 114 and Junior Colleges.

SECTION 7. The following public community and junior colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by Sections 1, 2 and 3 of this act:

No. 2050 \*SSO5/A292\* 052E/SS05/A292 PAGE 4 127 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none 128 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the 129 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any 130 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a 131 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.

132 SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 133 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 134 135 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and 136 137 allied health student loans and providing instructional support for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning 138 139 July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... \$ 1,200,000.00. The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as 140 141 follows:

142 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)143 public community and junior colleges.

144 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of 145 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and 146 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the 147 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent 148 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside 149 within the State of Mississippi.

The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public community and junior colleges, to fund life and health insurance, S. B. No. 2050 \*SS05/A292\*

052E/SS05/A292 PAGE 5 160 for all employees of the public community and junior colleges for 161 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006. 162 .....\$ 18,494,100.00.

163 The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to 164 participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health 165 Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in this section which are 166 not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for 167 the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

SECTION 11. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at each of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006...... \$ 4,500,000.00.

SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006...... \$ 179,050.00.

SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006..... \$ 3,599,160.00.

SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the S. 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193 Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges 194 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending

The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 15. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 37-155-5(d)(iii).

SECTION 16. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

SECTION 17. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of Advanced Training Centers at each of the Public Community and Junior Colleges, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2006......\$ 2,250,000.00.

SECTION 18. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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Committee for Fiscal Year 2007.

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Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. **SECTION 19.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005.
