6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
8	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
9	maintenance of the Mississippi Department of Corrections for the

L2	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L3	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special

170	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
171	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
172	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
173	Services" for Fiscal Year 2007 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2006
174	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
175	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2007 budget by the
176	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
177	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
178	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
179	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
180	act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
181	that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
182	cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2006 appropriation for "Personal
183	Services" when annualized, with the exception of escalated funds.
184	If, at the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
185	Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
186	has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
187	projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2006 "Personal Services"
188	appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
189	reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
190	requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
191	such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
192	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
193	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
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allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 194 195 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 196 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 197 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 198 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 199 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public Accountant License or higher level professional certification as determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise authorized in this act.

SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 221 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 222 223 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 224 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 225 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

258 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 259 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 260 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 261 Committee for Fiscal Year 2007. 262 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 263 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the 264 jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the 265 department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of 266 fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities 267 furnished to said housing. The Department of Corrections shall 268 not pay for the installation or monthly service of any telephone installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction. 269 270 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 271 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be 272 authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney 273 274 General. 275 SECTION 7. No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the 276 277 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the 278 279 Governor in each specific case. 280 SECTION 8. None of the money herein appropriated shall be paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47, 281 282 Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. 283 284 Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually 285 make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance 286 Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General 287 stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of 288 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being 289 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 290 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated.

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- 291 In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above
- 292 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive
- 293 any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence
- 294 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin
- 295 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi
- 296 Department of Corrections.
- 297 **SECTION 9.** It is the intent of the Legislature that all
- 298 prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per
- 299 day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those
- 300 incarcerated in maximum security.
- 301 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 302 Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
- 303 budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise
- 304 available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the
- 305 purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for
- 306 use within the department.
- 307 **SECTION 11.** None of the funds appropriated herein can be
- 308 directly or indirectly associated with the ACA accreditation in
- 309 the Community Services Division.
- 310 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 311 per diem rates paid to regional facilities shall not exceed
- 312 Twenty-nine Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 313 All regional facilities shall continue to receive the annual three
- 314 percent (3%) increase in the per diem rate as authorized in
- 315 Section 47-5-933, Mississippi Code of 1972, however, in no event
- 316 shall any regional facility's per diem rate exceed Twenty-nine
- 317 Dollars and Seventy-four Cents (\$29.74) per inmate.
- 318 **SECTION 13.** Effective July 1, 2005, the department or its
- 319 contracted medical provider will pay to a provider of a medical
- 320 service for any and all incarcerated persons from a correctional
- 321 or detention facility an amount based upon negotiated fees as
- 322 agreed to by the medical care service providers and the department
- 323 and/or its contracted medical provider. In the absence of

negotiated discounted fee schedule, medical care service providers 324 325 will be paid by the department or its contracted medical service 326 provider an amount no greater than the reimbursement rate 327 applicable based on the Mississippi Medicaid reimbursement rate. 328 This limitation applies to all medical care services, durable and 329 nondurable goods, prescription drugs and medications provided to 330 any and all incarcerated persons outside of the correctional or 331 detention facility. SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 332 333 Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections shall 334 have the authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of 335 336 the Department of Corrections. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further 337 the intention of the Legislature that the Department of 338 Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to 339 340 the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month 341 prior to the effective date of the transfer. 342 343 SECTION 15. The Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections is hereby authorized to transfer spending authority 344 345 between and within budgets, both positions and funds, in an amount not to exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the authorized budgets 346 347 in the aggregate. It is further the intention of the Legislature 348 that the Department of Corrections shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office 349 350 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of the month prior to the effective date of the 351 transfer. However, no transfers shall be authorized which 352 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and 353 354 Fringe Benefits" in any budget authorized in Section 3 of this 355 act.

356	SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
357	Mississippi Department of Corrections shall have the authority to
358	receive, budget, and expend funds from any source, including
359	beginning cash in excess of beginning cash when spending authority
360	was initially appropriated, that may become available to the
361	department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the
362	Department of Finance and Administration in a matter consistent
363	with the escalation of federal funds.
364	SECTION 17. The department is authorized to expend available
365	funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when the
366	savings generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed
367	expenditures thereof.
368	SECTION 18. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
369	of Section 2, Fifty-six Million Dollars (\$56,000,000.00) shall be
370	derived from the Budget Contingency Fund, as created in Section
371	27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, to be allocated as follows:

377	SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
378	Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept,
379	budget and expend any portion of confiscated funds received in
380	conjunction with its participating in investigations of illegal
381	activities of any offender under the supervision of the agency.
382	These funds shall be used to provide security enhancement within
383	the Department of Corrections.
384	SECTION 20. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
385	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
386	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
387	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 21. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2005.
