No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 192 193 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 194 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 195 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 196 The agency shall not take any action to promote or otherwise 197 award salary increases through reallocation, reclassification, 198 realignment, education benchmark, career ladder, or any other means to increase salaries of employees or positions unless 199 200 specifically exempted by the following conditions: the award of teacher pay increases, the advancement of a trainee/cadet to the 201 202 next level of a bona fide career ladder, the award of an 203 educational benchmark for the attainment of Certified Public 204 Accountant License or higher level professional certification as 205 determined by the State Personnel Board, the immediate replacement of a departing employee with an individual from within state 206 207 service or a new hire at a salary level equivalent to that of the 208 departing employee, and the emergency appointment of nurses, 209 pharmacists or other health care professionals at a salary to be 210 determined by the State Personnel Board, unless otherwise 211 authorized in this act. SECTION 4. The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a 212 213 case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of 214 employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was 215 216 created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous 217 application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective 218 salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive. 219 Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major 220 221 object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated 222 compensatory time within funds available.
