SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 501

1 2	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION WELCOMING THE DOUBLE-A MISSISSIPPI BRAVES BASEBALL TEAM TO THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI.
3	WHEREAS, on Monday, April 18, 2005, Double-A affiliated
4	baseball returned to the Magnolia State, when the Mississippi
5	Braves, the AA Southern League Franchise of the Atlanta Braves,
6	played their first game at the \$25 Million "Trustmark Park" in
7	Pearl, Mississippi; and
8	WHEREAS, Mississippi Braves General Manager Steve DeSalvo and
9	Field Manager Brian Snitker have presented central Mississippi
10	with a 5,500 seat (7,319 capacity) state of the art stadium that
11	will serve as home for the AA Mississippi Braves. Private stadium
12	financing is assisted through state and municipal sales tax rebate
13	incentives under the Mississippi Tourism Incentive Program, and
14	access road construction; and
15	WHEREAS, the Atlanta Braves parent organization's streak of
16	13 straight division championships is a well-known accomplishment
17	which has been driven by a successful farm league system. Less
18	publicized but equally significant is the fact that for 14
19	straight years, the Braves minor league system has placed seventh
20	or higher in talent rankings published by Baseball America. There
21	is an obvious correlation, the Braves organization has done a
22	remarkably consistent job of developing talent to supply their
23	major league club and central Mississippi is the beneficiary of
24	this sports entertainment and economic development product; and
25	WHEREAS, Double-A is the fifth of six levels in the Atlanta
26	minor league system, and the AA Braves has sent stars to the
27	majors such as Chipper Jones, Andruw Jones, Marcus Giles, Javy
