- 4 DECORATION.
- 5 WHEREAS, on May 24, 2005, family members and friends joined
- military officials to welcome home Sergeant First Class Ellis 6
- 7 Martin of Summit, Mississippi, a member of the Army National
- Guard's 155th Brigade Combat Team, who was critically wounded more 8
- 9 than two months ago in Iraq; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Martin was escorted into the Jackson International
- Airport terminal by Major General Harold Cross, Adjutant General 11
- for the Mississippi Army National Guard; and 12
- WHEREAS, Sergeant Martin and Sergeant Robert Shane Pugh were 13
- injured in March 2005 when an improvised explosive device 14
- detonated near their vehicle 30 miles south of Baghdad. Sergeant 15
- 16 Pugh, a Combat Medic with the 155th, was credited with helping his
- wounded comrade before dying; and 17
- WHEREAS, Sergeant Martin passed through an Honor Guard of 18
- 19 soldiers at the airport in a motorized wheelchair before being
- presented the Purple Heart by General Cross, who called Martin a 20
- 21 "great warrior." His wife, Stephanie, and Amanda Pugh, wife of
- his fallen comrade, were at his side; and 22
- 23 WHEREAS, General Cross said earlier that Martin needed 52
- 24 units of blood while en route from Iraq to a hospital in Germany.
- Martin later underwent several surgeries at Walter Reed Army 25
- 26 Medical Center in Washington, D.C., but came home to Mississippi
- 27 to see his 18-year-old daughter graduate from high school; and

WHEREAS, the 155th Brigade Combat Team consists of nearly 28 29 3,500 soldiers from Mississippi, Arkansas and Vermont. 30 soldiers trained at Camp Shelby near Hattiesburg, Mississippi, and 31 deployed in January; and 32 WHEREAS, Mississippians understand the costs of conflict, 33 because we have paid them in the past, and it is with great pride and humility that we recognize the heroic action of this great 34 American and Mississippian, who is the guardian of civilization as 35 we know it today: 36 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 37 38 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby recognize the gallant service of Sergeant First Class Ellis Martin of Summit, Mississippi, who was 39 40 severely wounded in Iraq and was awarded the Army's Purple Heart Decoration by the President of the United States, and extend the 41 thoughts and prayers of the Senate to his family for his speedy 42 recovery. 43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to 44 45 Sergeant Martin and his family and be made available to the
