- 2. COMMENDING THE LIFE OF UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS LANCE CORPORAL
- MARC LUCAS TUCKER OF PONTOTOC, MISSISSIPPI, WHO WAS KILLED IN IRAQ ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 8, 2005, AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE 3

- 6 WHEREAS, Marine Lance Corporal Marc Lucas Tucker, 24, of
- 7 Pontotoc, Mississippi was killed on Wednesday, June 8, 2005, in a
- nonhostile Humvee accident, when the vehicle in which he was 8
- 9 riding overturned while on a night mission in Asr Uranium, Iraq;
- and 10
- WHEREAS, Corporal Tucker was assigned to the 9th Engineer 11
- Support Battalion, 3rd Force Service Support Group, III Marine 12
- Expeditionary Force, based in Okinawa, Japan; and 13
- 14 WHEREAS, carried by a military honor guard, he came home to
- his community and family, and was buried Wednesday, June 15, 2005, 15
- 16 at Oak Forest Cemetery in the Randolph Community with full
- military honors; and 17
- WHEREAS, since operations began in Iraq and Afghanistan, 33 18
- 19 soldiers or sailors with Mississippi ties have been killed.
- 20 Corporal Tucker is the third northeast Mississippi soldier to die
- 21 in Iraq; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Marc Tucker was a 1999 graduate of South Pontotoc
- 23 Attendance Center. His Principal described Marc as a young man
- 24 who enjoyed life and made friends wherever he went. He was a very
- patriotic young man who dreamed of being a Marine, and joined that 25
- elite branch of service in November 2003. "He died doing 26
- 27 absolutely what he loved. He wanted to do his part"; and

WHEREAS, during his funeral, Corporal Tucker was awarded the 28 29 Navy Cross and the Mississippi Medal of Valor by Marine Major John 30 Harding of Boston, Massachusetts; and WHEREAS, his family received an outpouring of grief and 31 32 support from across the state, demonstrating the community's 33 acknowledgment of the sacrifice made by this Mississippian; and WHEREAS, Marc is survived by his parents, Donna and Kelly 34 Bagwell of Pontotoc; his father, Mark Tucker of Pontotoc; two 35 sisters, Christy Irby (Forrest) of Oxford, and Pam Bolen (Gregg) 36 37 of Pontotoc; a brother, Terry Bagwell (Jennifer) of Pontotoc; his 38 grandparents, John Austin and Daphna Bland of Randolph, Baxter and Minnie Tucker of Pontotoc, and Arlis and Motee Bagwell of 39 40 Pontotoc; his great-grandmother, Annie Rea of Randolph; a niece, 41 Madison Bagwell; two nephews, Ben Ibry and Hunter Bagwell; and WHEREAS, to a country, a fallen soldier means a national 42 loss; to a community, a fallen soldier means a true hero; to a 43 44 parent, a fallen soldier means a son who won't be coming home. Mississippians understand the costs of conflict, because we have 45 paid them in the past, and it is with great pride and humility 46 47 that we recognize the heroic action of this great American and 48 Mississippian, who was the guardian of civilization as we know it 49 today: NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 50 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 51 52 we do hereby remember the gallant service and commend the life of United States Marine Corps Lance Corporal Marc Lucas Tucker of 53 54 Pontotoc, Mississippi, who was killed in Iraq on Wednesday, June 55 8, 2005, and extend the thoughts and prayers of the Legislature to 56 his family and our sorrow on his passing. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to 57 58 the surviving family of Corporal Tucker and be made available to 59 members of the Capitol Press Corps.
