## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION REMEMBERING THE GALLANT SERVICE AND COMMENDING 1 THE LIFE OF UNITED STATES ARMY STAFF SERGEANT SCOTTIE LEE BRIGHT 2. OF JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, WHO WAS KILLED IN IRAQ ON TUESDAY, JULY 5, 2005, AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE SENATE. 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Scottie Lee Bright, 36, of Jackson, 6 Mississippi, was killed on Tuesday, July 5, 2005, when an 7 enemy-improvised explosive device detonated near his HMMWV (Heavy Mobility Maneuverable Wheel Vehicle) during patrol operations in 8 9 Baghdad, Iraq. The blast also claimed the life of Corporal Lyle Cambridge, 23, of Shiprock, New Mexico; and 10 WHEREAS, Sergeant Bright was assigned to the Third Squadron, 11 3rd ACR (Armored Calvary Regiment) out of Fort Carson Military 12 Reservation near Colorado Springs, Colorado; and 13 WHEREAS, carried by a military honor guard, he came home to 14 his community and family, and will be buried on Saturday, July 16, 15 16 2005, at Autumn Woods Cemetery in Jackson, Mississippi. During his funeral, Sergeant Bright will be awarded the Purple Heart and 17 the Mississippi Medal of Valor; and 18 19 WHEREAS, since operations began in Iraq and Afghanistan, 36 soldiers or sailors with Mississippi ties have been killed, and 20 21 the regiment at Fort Carson has lost 129 soldiers; and WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Scottie Lee Bright was born on July 22 23 16, 1968, in Jackson, Mississippi. He was the fifth child born to Blanche Neal Bright and the late Willie Bright, Sr., and he was an 24 inspiration to his family. He accepted Jesus Christ at an early 25 26 age and joined the New Hope Baptist Church. He attended Raines and Powers Elementary Schools and Enochs Junior High School. Upon 27

entering Lanier High School, Scottie joined the ROTC and continued

- 29 with the corp until he graduated in 1986. After graduation,
- 30 Scottie began work for K&B Toys where he advanced to Manager
- 31 before leaving the company to join the United States Army. In
- 32 1990, Scottie met and later married the former Carolyn Hobson.
- 33 This union formed a strong bond and a family with two beautiful
- 34 children, Breshay Nicole and Scottie ("BJ"), Jr.; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Scottie entered the United States Army on October
- 36 29, 1991. He completed the Basic Combat Training Program at Fort
- 37 Sill, Oklahoma, and was assigned to Schofield, Hawaii, from 1992
- 38 to 1994. He was assigned to Fort Hood, Texas, from 1994 to 2002.
- 39 While assigned there, he was sent to Korea from June 2001 to May
- 40 2002, and in June 2002, Scottie was assigned to Fort Carson,
- 41 Colorado. He served in Iraq from April 2003 to March 2004, prior
- 42 to his second deployment which began on February 28, 2005, and
- 43 ended on July 5, 2005; and
- WHEREAS, his family received an outpouring of grief and
- 45 support from across the state, demonstrating the community's
- 46 acknowledgment of the sacrifice made by this Mississippian; and
- WHEREAS, Scottie leaves to cherish his memory a loving and
- 48 devoted wife, Carolyn Hobson Bright; two children, daughter,
- 49 Breshay Nicole Bright, son, Scottie Lee Bright, Jr., both of Fort
- 50 Carson, Colorado; a loving mother, Blanche Bright, Jackson,
- 51 Mississippi; two sisters, Martha Adams and Vanessa Hinds, both of
- 52 Jackson, Mississippi; three brothers, Edward (Marian) Adams,
- 53 Chicago, Illinois, Willie (Bobbie) Bright and Robert Bright,
- 54 Jackson, Mississippi; father-in-law, Jack Robinson, Jackson,
- 55 Mississippi; godmother-in-law, Myrtle Butler, Jackson,
- 56 Mississippi; sister-in-law, Katina Collins, Jackson, Mississippi;
- 57 brother-in-law, Kiven Miner, Jackson, Mississippi; two aunts,
- 58 Velma Neal and Ruthie (Kitty) Cox, both of Jackson, Mississippi;
- 59 uncle, Robert Hays, Sr., (who has served as a surrogate father to
- 60 Scottie since Willie Bright, Sr.'s death); special cousin, Robert

- 61 Hays, Jr., (whom Scottie regarded as his brother); and a host of
- 62 other close relatives and friends; and
- WHEREAS, to a country, a fallen soldier means a national
- 64 loss; to a community, a fallen soldier means a true hero; to a
- 65 parent, a fallen soldier means a son who won't be coming home.
- 66 Mississippians understand the costs of conflict, because we have
- 67 paid them in the past, and it is with great pride and humility
- 68 that we recognize the heroic action of this great American and
- 69 Mississippian, who was the guardian of civilization as we know it
- 70 today:
- 71 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 72 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby remember the gallant service and
- 73 commend the life of United States Army Staff Sergeant Scottie Lee
- 74 Bright of Jackson, Mississippi, who was killed in Iraq on Tuesday,
- 75 July 5, 2005, and extend the thoughts and prayers of the Senate to
- 76 his family and our sorrow on his passing.
- 77 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 78 the surviving family of Sergeant Bright and be made available to
- 79 the members of the Capitol Press Corps.
