## HOUSE BILL NO. 43

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-17-123, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT IF THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER AND THE STATE 3 TREASURER MAKE A DETERMINATION THAT STATE-SOURCE SPECIAL FUNDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT TO COVER DEFICIENCIES IN THE GENERAL FUND, THAT THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI IS UNABLE TO REPAY SPECIAL FUND BORROWING 6 WITHIN THE FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH THE BORROWING WAS DONE OR THAT THE 7 STATE SOURCE FUNDS ARE INSUFFICIENT FOR DISASTER SUPPORT OR 8 ASSISTANCE PURPOSES DUE TO HURRICANES KATRINA AND RITA, AND THAT 9 THE STATE BOND COMMISSION MAKES A DETERMINATION THAT THE 10 DEFICIENCY OR INABILITY TO REPAY, OR INSUFFICIENCY IS THE RESULT OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY WITHIN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE STATE 11 BOND COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED TO OBTAIN A LINE OF CREDIT, IN AN 12 AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$500,000,000.00, FROM A COMMERCIAL LENDER, INVESTMENT BANKING GROUP OR A CONSORTIUM OF EITHER OR BOTH; TO 13 14 PROVIDE THAT THE LENGTH OF THE INDEBTEDNESS SHALL NOT EXTEND 15 BEYOND THREE YEARS FOLLOWING THE ORIGINATION OF THE LINE OF 16 CREDIT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE LINE OF CREDIT SHALL BE AUTHORIZED AND 17 18 APPROVED BY THE STATE BOND COMMISSION AND HAVE SUCH TERMS AND DETAILS AS PROVIDED BY RESOLUTION OF THE STATE BOND COMMISSION; TO 19 PROVIDE THAT THOSE PROCEEDS SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO THE DISASTER 20 21 RECOVERY FUND AND DISBURSED BY THE STATE TREASURER TO COVER DEFICIENCIES IN THE GENERAL FUND, TO REPAY SPECIAL FUND BORROWING AND/OR TO COVER ANY INSUFFICIENCY IN DISASTER SUPPORT OR 22 23 ASSISTANCE; TO PROVIDE THAT UPON THE APPROVAL OF THE STATE FISCAL 24 25 OFFICER, THE DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT 26 AGENCY MAY USE FUNDS FROM THE DISASTER RECOVERY FUND TO MATCH 27 FEDERAL FUNDS AND FOR PERSONNEL RELATED EXPENSES DUE TO THE HURRICANE KATRINA AND/OR HURRICANE RITA DISASTERS; TO CREATE THE 28 DISASTER RECOVERY FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY, WHICH SHALL CONSIST 29 OF LOAN PROCEEDS FROM THE LINE OF CREDIT AUTHORIZED BY THIS ACT; 30 31 TO REQUIRE THE STATE TREASURER TO MAKE QUARTERLY REPORTS OF EACH TRANSFER INTO AND OUT OF THE DISASTER RECOVERY FUND; TO AMEND 32 SECTION 27-104-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO SUSPEND UNTIL JULY 33 1, 2006, THE REQUIREMENT FOR THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER TO REDUCE 35 ALLOCATIONS OF GENERAL FUNDS AND STATE-SOURCE SPECIAL FUNDS TO STATE AGENCIES WHEN GENERAL FUND REVENUES RECEIVED FOR THE FISCAL 36 YEAR FALL BELOW 98% OF THE SINE DIE GENERAL FUND REVENUE ESTIMATE; 37 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 38 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 39 40 SECTION 1. Section 31-17-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 41 31-17-123. (1) The intent of the Legislature is to 42 43 authorize borrowing funds under the provisions of Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 to offset any temporary cash flow 44

deficiencies and should not be construed to authorize the

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- 46 borrowing of any funds in an amount that cannot be repaid during
- 47 the fiscal year in which the funds are borrowed.
- 48 (2) (a) Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to
- 49 the contrary, if the <u>State Fiscal Officer and the State Treasurer</u>
- 50 make a determination that (i) state-source special funds are not
- 51 sufficient to cover deficiencies in the General Fund, (ii) the
- 52 State of Mississippi is unable to repay special fund borrowing
- 53 within the fiscal year in which it was borrowed, or (iii)
- 54 state-source funds are insufficient for disaster support and/or
- 55 assistance purposes due to Hurricanes Katrina and/or Rita; and
- 56 that the State Bond Commission makes a determination that the
- 57 deficiency, inability to repay, or insufficiency is the result of
- 58 a state of emergency within the State of Mississippi, the State
- 59 Bond Commission is authorized to obtain a line of credit, in an
- 60 amount not to exceed Five Hundred Million Dollars
- 61 (\$500,000,000.00), from a commercial lender, investment banking
- 62 group or a consortium of either, or both. The length of
- 63 indebtedness under this subsection shall not extend past three (3)
- 64 years following the origination of the line of credit. The line
- of credit shall be authorized and approved by the State Bond
- 66 Commission and shall have such terms and details as may be
- 67 provided by resolution of the State Bond Commission. Loan
- 68 proceeds shall be deposited into the Disaster Recovery Fund
- 69 created in paragraph (d) of this subsection, and shall be
- 70 <u>disbursed</u> by the State Treasurer to cover deficiencies in the
- 71 General Fund, to repay special fund borrowing and/or to cover any
- 72 insufficiency in disaster support and/or assistance.
- 73 (b) As security for the repayment of the principal and
- 74 interest on the line of credit provided for in paragraph (a) of
- 75 this subsection, the full faith, credit and resources of the State
- 76 of Mississippi are irrevocably pledged.
- 77 (c) Upon approval of the State Fiscal Officer, the
- 78 <u>Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency is</u>

- 79 authorized to use amounts from the Disaster Recovery Fund to match
- 80 federal funds, and for personnel, call-back wages, base and
- 81 overtime wages, travel, per diem and other out-of-pocket expenses
- 82 incurred as a result of Hurricanes Katrina and/or Rita.
- 83 (d) There is created in the State Treasury a special
- 84 fund to be designated as the "Disaster Recovery Fund," which shall
- 85 consist of loan proceeds from the line of credit authorized under
- 86 paragraph (a) of this subsection, funds appropriated or otherwise
- 87 made available by the Legislature for deposit into the fund, and
- 88 funds from any other source designated for deposit into the fund.
- 89 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal
- 90 year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any
- 91 investment earnings or interest earned on amounts in the fund
- 92 shall be deposited to the credit of the fund.
- 93 (e) The State Treasurer shall notify the Legislative
- 94 Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration of
- 95 each transfer into and out of the Disaster Recovery Fund on a
- 96 quarterly basis.
- 97 (f) This subsection (2) shall be complete authority for
- 98 the borrowing authorized under this subsection and shall not be
- 99 subject to the limitations provided in the other provisions of
- 100 this chapter or otherwise under state law.
- SECTION 2. Section 27-104-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 102 amended as follows:
- 103 27-104-13. (1) The State Fiscal Officer may disapprove or
- 104 reduce and revise the estimates of general funds and state-source
- 105 special funds for any general fund or special fund agency and for
- 106 the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi
- 107 Department of Transportation, in an amount not to exceed five
- 108 percent (5%), if at any time he finds that funds will not be
- 109 available within the period for which the budget is drawn, or if
- 110 at any time he finds that the requested expenditures, or any part

thereof, are not authorized by law, and that action shall be reported to the Legislative Budget Office.

The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of need based upon a finding that funds will not be available within the period for which the budget is drawn, transfer funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement the general fund revenue.

If the estimates of general funds and state-source special funds of all general fund and special fund agencies and of the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi Department of Transportation have been reduced by five percent (5%), additional reductions may be made, but shall consist of a uniform percentage reduction of general funds and state-source special funds to all general fund and special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi Department of Transportation.

Any state-source special funds reduced under the provisions of this subsection (1) shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions for warrants signed by the respective agency head, and the transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined by the State Fiscal Officer.

(2) The State Tax Commission and University Research Center, utilizing all available revenue forecast data, shall annually develop a general fund revenue estimate to be adopted by the Legislative Budget Office as of the date of sine die adjournment.

136 If, at the end of October, or at the end of any month
137 thereafter of any fiscal year, the revenues received for the
138 fiscal year fall below ninety-eight percent (98%) of the
139 Legislative Budget Office general fund revenue estimate at the
140 date of sine die adjournment, the State Fiscal Officer shall
141 reduce allocations of general funds and state-source special funds

Department of Transportation, in an amount necessary to keep 144 145 expenditures within the sum of actual general fund receipts, 146 including any transfers to the General Fund from the Working 147 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund for the fiscal year. 148 The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of need 149 based on the revenue shortfall, transfer funds as provided in 150 Section 27-103-203 from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement the general fund revenue. 151 152 State-source special funds in an amount equal to any reduction made under the provisions of this subsection (2) shall be 153 154 transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions for 155 warrants signed by the respective agency head, and the transfer 156 shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined by the 157 State Fiscal Officer. No agency's allocation shall be reduced in an amount to 158 159 exceed five percent (5%); however, if the allocations of general 160 funds and state-source special funds to all general fund and 161 special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi Department of Transportation 162 163 have been reduced by five percent (5%), any additional reductions required to be made under this subsection (2) shall consist of a 164 165 uniform percentage reduction of general funds and state-source 166 special funds to all general fund and special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi 167 168 Department of Transportation. Any receipt from loans authorized by Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 shall not be included as 169 170 revenue receipts. The State Fiscal Officer shall immediately send notice of any 171 action taken under authority of this subsection (2) to the 172 Legislative Budget Office. 173 174 The provisions of this subsection (2) requiring the State 175 Fiscal Officer to reduce allocations of general funds and

186	or from donations; special funds held in a fiduciary capacity for
187	the benefit of specific persons or classes of persons;
188	self-generated special funds of the state institutions of higher
189	learning or the state community or junior colleges; special funds
190	of Mississippi Industries for the Blind, the State Port at
191	Gulfport, Yellow Creek Inland Port, Pat Harrison Waterway
192	District, Pearl River Basin Development District, Pearl River
193	Valley Water Management District, Tombigbee River Valley Water
194	Management District, Yellow Creek Watershed Authority, or Coast
195	Coliseum Commission; special funds of the Department of Wildlife,
196	Fisheries and Parks derived from the issuance of hunting or
197	fishing licenses; and special funds generated by agencies whose
198	primary function includes the establishment of standards and the
199	issuance of licenses for the practice of a profession within the
