SENATE BILL NO. 2008 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-104-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL TRANSFERS BETWEEN MAJOR BUDGET CATEGORIES 3 BY CERTAIN STATE AGENCIES DUE TO FINANCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES CAUSED BY HURRICANE KATRINA; TO AMEND SECTION 27-104-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 4 1972, TO AUTHORIZE CERTAIN STATE AGENCIES TO ESCALATE AND EXPEND 5 CERTAIN FEDERAL OR SPECIAL SOURCE FUNDS DUE TO FINANCIAL 6 7 CIRCUMSTANCES CAUSED BY HURRICANE KATRINA; AND FOR RELATED 8 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 27-104-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 11 amended as follows: 27-104-17. (1) An allotment period shall be one-half (1/2) 12 of twelve (12) months, and expenditure one-half (1/2) of the 13 appropriated amount, unless otherwise specified in the 14 appropriation bill or justified by the agency to the Department of 15 Finance and Administration, and the first allotment period shall 16 commence on July 1. Estimates shall be filed with the Department 17 18 of Finance and Administration not later than the first day of the month preceding the beginning period. 19 Provided further, that the Department of Finance and 20 21 Administration may, in its discretion, restrict an agency to 2.2 monthly allotment period when it becomes evident that an agency's rate of expenditure to date indicates this restriction will be 23 24 necessary to prevent depletion of its appropriation prior to the 25 close of the fiscal year or when the condition of the State General Fund requires monthly monitoring and control of the rate 26 of General Fund expenditures. 27 28 Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3), and

unless otherwise specified in the agency appropriation bill, in

the event any emergency or unforeseen circumstances shall arise,

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    the agency head may authorize increases in major objects of
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    expenditure within each specific budget within each appropriation
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    bill in total amounts not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the
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    appropriated amount of each object, provided that other major
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    objects of expenditure are decreased by a corresponding dollar
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    amount. No transfers shall be authorized which increase or
    decrease the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and
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    Fringe Benefits," or which increase the major object of
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    expenditure "Capital Outlay - Equipment." The agency head shall
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    submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative
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    Budget Office, the Department of Finance and Administration, and
    the State Auditor, on or before the fifteenth of the month prior
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    to the effective date of the transfer. The transfer shall be
    effective the first working day of the month following timely
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    submissions required herein. In cases of extreme hardship,
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    certified in writing by the agency head and submitted with timely
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    submissions required herein, the Executive Director of the
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    Department of Finance and Administration, in his discretion, may
    authorize an earlier effective date for the transfer.
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         (3) From and after passage and until June 30, 2006, due to
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    the unforeseen financial circumstances caused by Hurricane
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    Katrina, the agency heads of the following state agencies, with
    the approval of the Department of Finance and Administration, may
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    authorize increases in major objects of expenditure within each
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    specific budget within each appropriation bill, provided that
    other major objects of expenditure are decreased by a
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    corresponding dollar amount: State Contractors Board, State
    Veterans' Affairs Board, State Board of Engineers and Land
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    Surveyors, State Board of Animal Health, State Pharmacy Board,
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    Mississippi Nursing Board, Port of Gulfport, Mississippi
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    Department of Employment Security, Mississippi Insurance
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    Department, Mississippi Department of Mental Health, Mississippi
    Department of Finance and Administration, Mississippi Department

68 <u>Mississippi Gulf Coast Coliseum, Secretary of State, Mississippi</u>

72 <u>shall submit written justification for the transfer(s) to the</u>

73 Department of Finance and Administration, the Legislative Budget

74 Office and the State Auditor on or before the fifteenth of the

75 month prior to the effective date of the transfer. The transfer

76 shall be effective the first working day of the month following

77 timely submissions and approval required herein. In cases of

78 extreme hardship, certified in writing by the agency head and

79 timely submitted as required herein, the Executive Director of the

80 Department of Finance and Administration, in his discretion, may

81 authorize an earlier effective date for the transfer.

82 **SECTION 2.** Section 27-104-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 83 amended as follows:

84 27-104-21. (1) All general and special fund agencies shall,

85 upon making application for federal funds, forward a summary of

86 such applications to the Legislative Budget Office. The

87 Legislative Budget Office shall have an opportunity to review such

88 applications and make its comments thereon to the Executive

89 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration and the

90 state agency making application. Unless otherwise specified in

91 the appropriation bill, the Executive Director of the Department

92 of Finance and Administration shall have the authority to approve

93 escalations in a budget using one hundred percent (100%) federal

94 money.

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95 [From and after passage and until June 30, 2006, this

96 <u>subsection (2) shall read as follows:</u>]

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97	(2) The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and
98	Administration shall have the authority to approve escalations of
99	funds and employee positions in the following budgets using one
100	hundred percent (100%) federal or other special source funds
101	available and necessary to assist agencies with any unforeseen
102	financial circumstances specifically related to Hurricane Katrina:
103	State Gaming Commission, State Tax Commission, State Contractors
104	Board, State Architecture Board, State Veterans' Affairs Board,
105	Port of Gulfport, Mississippi Forestry Commission, Mississippi
106	Department of Insurance, Mississippi Department of Environmental
107	Quality, Mississippi Department of Health, Mississippi Department
108	of Finance and Administration (excluding rent), State Veterans'
109	Home Purchase Board, Mississippi Department of Human Services,
110	State Board of Engineers and Land Surveyors, Mississippi
111	Department of Transportation, and the Office of State Aid Road
112	Construction of the Mississippi Department of Transportation. New
113	employee positions funded one hundred percent (100%) by or from
114	federal funds may be authorized by the Executive Director of the
115	Department of Finance and Administration subject to the rules and
116	regulations of the State Personnel Board. No federal or other
117	special source funds may be expended for programs or activities
118	other than those which have been authorized by act of the
119	Legislature or which are encompassed by a state agency's program
120	structure as provided by law, provided, however, that any
121	expenditures related to a Hurricane Katrina relief program shall
122	be specifically authorized. The Executive Director of the
123	Department of Finance and Administration shall immediately send
124	notice of the approval of such budget escalation to the
125	Legislative Budget Office. The Executive Director of the
126	Department of Finance and Administration shall ensure that the
127	Legislative Budget Office receives timely, detailed and accurate
128	information about the amount and use of federal and special source
129	<u>hurricane relief</u> funds by state agencies.
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130 [From and after July 1, 2006, this subsection (2) shall read

131 as follows:]

- 132 (2) New employee positions funded one hundred percent (100%)
- 133 by or from federal funds may be authorized by the Executive
- 134 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration subject
- 135 to the rules and regulations of the State Personnel Board. No
- 136 federal funds may be expended for programs or activities other
- 137 than those which have been authorized by act of the Legislature or
- 138 which are encompassed by a state agency's program structure as
- 139 provided by law. The Executive Director of the Department of
- 140 Finance and Administration shall immediately send notice of the
- 141 approval of such budget escalation to the Legislative Budget
- 142 Office. The Executive Director of the Department of Finance and
- 143 Administration shall ensure that the Legislative Budget Office
- 144 receives timely, detailed and accurate information about the
- 145 amount and use of federal funds by state agencies.
- 146 (3) The Department of Finance and Administration shall
- 147 require, by rule and regulation, that each agency receiving
- 148 federal funds shall apply for federal reimbursement for state
- 149 central services costs in accordance with Office of Management and
- 150 Budget Circular A-21 or A-87, which reimbursement shall be
- 151 deposited directly into the Statewide Cost Allocation Fund, which
- 152 is hereby established within the State Treasury. An agency's
- 153 failure to timely apply for such reimbursement shall be condition
- 154 sufficient to authorize the Department of Finance and
- 155 Administration to transfer an amount equal to not less than fifty
- 156 percent (50%) nor more than one hundred percent (100%) of the
- 157 total amount designated to such agency in the applicable fixed
- 158 cost agreement of the state central service cost allocation plan.
- 159 These funds shall be transferred from any available funds within
- 160 such agency into the Statewide Cost Allocation Fund upon execution
- 161 of a requisition for issuance of warrant by the Executive Director
- 162 of the Department of Finance and Administration. Any funds on

- 163 hand in said Statewide Cost Allocation Fund at the end of the
- 164 fiscal year shall lapse into the State General Fund.
- 165 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 166 and after its passage.
