COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2019

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-17-123, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT IF THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER AND THE STATE 2 TREASURER MAKE A DETERMINATION THAT STATE-SOURCE SPECIAL FUNDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT TO COVER DEFICIENCIES IN THE GENERAL FUND, THAT THE 3 4 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI IS UNABLE TO REPAY SPECIAL FUND BORROWING 5 б WITHIN THE FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH THE BORROWING WAS DONE OR THAT THE 7 STATE SOURCE FUNDS ARE INSUFFICIENT FOR DISASTER SUPPORT OR 8 ASSISTANCE PURPOSES DUE TO HURRICANES KATRINA AND RITA, AND THAT 9 THE STATE BOND COMMISSION MAKES A DETERMINATION THAT SUCH DEFICIENCY OR INABILITY TO REPAY OR INSUFFICIENCY IS THE RESULT OF 10 11 A STATE OF EMERGENCY WITHIN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE STATE BOND COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED TO OBTAIN A LINE OF CREDIT, IN AN 12 AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$500,000,000.00, FROM A COMMERCIAL LENDER, INVESTMENT BANKING GROUP OR A CONSORTIUM OF EITHER OR BOTH; TO 13 14 PROVIDE THAT THE LENGTH OF SUCH INDEBTEDNESS SHALL NOT EXTEND 15 BEYOND THREE YEARS FOLLOWING THE ORIGINATION OF THE LINE OF 16 CREDIT; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH LINE OF CREDIT SHALL BE AUTHORIZED 17 AND APPROVED BY THE STATE BOND COMMISSION AND HAVE SUCH TERMS AND 18 DETAILS AS PROVIDED BY RESOLUTION OF THE STATE BOND COMMISSION; TO 19 20 PROVIDE THAT SUCH PROCEEDS SHALL BE RECEIVED BY THE STATE TREASURER AND DEPOSITED INTO THE DISASTER RECOVERY FUND AND USED 21 TO COVER DEFICIENCIES IN THE GENERAL FUND, TO REPAY SPECIAL FUND BORROWING AND/OR TO COVER ANY INSUFFICIENCY IN DISASTER SUPPORT OR 22 23 24 ASSISTANCE; TO ESTABLISH A DISASTER RECOVERY FUND FOR SUCH 25 PURPOSE; TO PROVIDE THAT UPON THE APPROVAL OF THE STATE FISCAL 26 OFFICER, THE DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY MAY USE FUNDS FROM THE LINE OF CREDIT TO MATCH FEDERAL FUNDS AND FOR PERSONNEL RELATED EXPENSES DUE TO THE HURRICANE 27 28 KATRINA AND/OR HURRICANE RITA DISASTERS; TO AMEND SECTION 29 27-104-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO SUSPEND UNTIL JULY 1, 2006, THE REQUIREMENT FOR THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER TO REDUCE 30 31 ALLOCATIONS OF GENERAL FUNDS AND STATE-SOURCE SPECIAL FUNDS TO 32 STATE AGENCIES WHEN GENERAL FUND REVENUES RECEIVED FOR THE FISCAL 33 34 YEAR FALL BELOW 98% OF THE SINE DIE GENERAL FUND REVENUE ESTIMATE; 35 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

36 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 37 SECTION 1. Section 31-17-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 38 amended as follows:

39 31-17-123. (1) The intent of the Legislature is to 40 authorize borrowing funds under the provisions of Sections 41 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 to offset any temporary cash flow 42 deficiencies and should not be construed to authorize the 43 borrowing of any funds in an amount that cannot be repaid during 44 the fiscal year in which the funds are borrowed.

45 (2) (a) Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to 46 the contrary, in the event that the State Fiscal Officer and the 47 State Treasurer make a determination that (i) state-source special 48 funds are not sufficient to cover deficiencies in the General Fund, (ii) the State of Mississippi is unable to repay special 49 fund borrowing within the fiscal year in which it was borrowed, or 50 (iii) state-source funds are insufficient for disaster support 51 52 and/or assistance purposes due to Hurricanes Katrina and/or Rita; 53 and that the State Bond Commission makes a determination that such deficiency, inability to repay, or insufficiency is the result of 54 a state of emergency within the State of Mississippi, the State 55 Bond Commission is authorized to obtain a line of credit, in an 56 57 amount not to exceed Five Hundred Million Dollars (\$500,000,000.00), from a commercial lender, investment banking 58 group or a consortium of either, or both. The length of 59 60 indebtedness under this subsection shall not extend past three (3) years following the origination of the line of credit. The line 61 62 of credit shall be authorized and approved by the State Bond Commission and shall have such terms and details as may be 63 64 provided by resolution of the State Bond Commission. Loan proceeds shall be received and disbursed by the State Treasurer 65 and deposited into the Disaster Recovery Fund, a special fund 66 67 hereby created in the State Treasury, and shall be used to cover 68 deficiencies in the General Fund, to repay special fund borrowing 69 and/or to cover any insufficiency in disaster support and/or 70 assistance. Monies remaining in the Disaster Recovery Fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, 71 72 but shall remain in the Disaster Recovery Fund. 73 (b) As security for the repayment of the principal and

74 interest on the line of credit provided for in paragraph (a) of

75 this subsection, the full faith, credit and resources of the State 76 of Mississippi are hereby irrevocably pledged.

77 (c) Upon approval of the State Fiscal Officer, the 78 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency is 79 authorized to use amounts from the line of credit to match federal 80 funds, and for personnel, call-back wages, base and overtime wages, travel, per diem and other out-of-pocket expenses incurred 81 as a result of Hurricanes Katrina and/or Rita. 82 (d) This subsection (2) shall be complete authority for 83 the borrowing authorized hereunder and shall not be subject to the 84 85 limitations provided in the other provisions of this chapter or 86 otherwise under state law.

87 (e) The State Treasurer shall notify the Legislative
 88 <u>Budget Office and the State Department of Finance and</u>

89 Administration of each transfer into and out of the Disaster

90 <u>Recovery Fund on a quarterly basis.</u>

91 SECTION 2. Section 27-104-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
92 amended as follows:

27-104-13. (1) The State Fiscal Officer may disapprove or 93 94 reduce and revise the estimates of general funds and state-source special funds for any general fund or special fund agency and for 95 96 the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi 97 Department of Transportation, in an amount not to exceed five percent (5%), if at any time he finds that funds will not be 98 99 available within the period for which the budget is drawn, or if at any time he finds that the requested expenditures, or any part 100 101 thereof, are not authorized by law, and that action shall be 102 reported to the Legislative Budget Office.

The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of need based upon a finding that funds will not be available within the period for which the budget is drawn, transfer funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement the general fund revenue.

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If the estimates of general funds and state-source special 108 109 funds of all general fund and special fund agencies and of the 110 "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi 111 Department of Transportation have been reduced by five percent 112 (5%), additional reductions may be made, but shall consist of a 113 uniform percentage reduction of general funds and state-source special funds to all general fund and special fund agencies and to 114 the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi 115 Department of Transportation. 116

117 Any state-source special funds reduced under the provisions 118 of this subsection (1) shall be transferred to the State General 119 Fund upon requisitions for warrants signed by the respective 120 agency head, and the transfer shall be made within a reasonable 121 period to be determined by the State Fiscal Officer.

(2) The State Tax Commission and University Research Center,
utilizing all available revenue forecast data, shall annually
develop a general fund revenue estimate to be adopted by the
Legislative Budget Office as of the date of sine die adjournment.

If, at the end of October, or at the end of any month 126 127 thereafter of any fiscal year, the revenues received for the fiscal year fall below ninety-eight percent (98%) of the 128 129 Legislative Budget Office general fund revenue estimate at the 130 date of sine die adjournment, the State Fiscal Officer shall reduce allocations of general funds and state-source special funds 131 132 to general fund and special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi 133 134 Department of Transportation, in an amount necessary to keep expenditures within the sum of actual general fund receipts, 135 including any transfers to the General Fund from the Working 136 137 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund for the fiscal year.

The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of need based on the revenue shortfall, transfer funds as provided in Section 27-103-203 from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve S. B. No. 2019 \*SS26/R43CS\* 055E/SS26/R43CS PAGE 4 Fund to the General Fund to supplement the general fund revenue. State-source special funds in an amount equal to any reduction made under the provisions of this subsection (2) shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions for warrants signed by the respective agency head, and the transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined by the State Fiscal Officer.

No agency's allocation shall be reduced in an amount to 148 exceed five percent (5%); however, if the allocations of general 149 funds and state-source special funds to all general fund and 150 151 special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi Department of Transportation 152 153 have been reduced by five percent (5%), any additional reductions required to be made under this subsection (2) shall consist of a 154 uniform percentage reduction of general funds and state-source 155 156 special funds to all general fund and special fund agencies and to 157 the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi 158 Department of Transportation. Any receipt from loans authorized by Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 shall not be included as 159 160 revenue receipts.

161 The State Fiscal Officer shall immediately send notice of any 162 action taken under authority of this subsection (2) to the 163 Legislative Budget Office.

The provisions of this subsection (2) requiring the State Fiscal Officer to reduce allocations of general funds and state-source special funds to general fund and special fund agencies and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall be suspended during the period from the effective date of this act through June <u>30, 2006.</u>

171 (3) For the purpose of this section, the term "state-source 172 special funds" means any special funds in any agency derived from 173 any source, but shall not include the following special funds: S. B. No. 2019 \*SS26/R43CS\* 055E/SS26/R43CS PAGE 5

special funds derived from federal sources, from local or regional 174 175 political subdivisions, from agricultural commodity assessments, 176 or from donations; special funds held in a fiduciary capacity for 177 the benefit of specific persons or classes of persons; 178 self-generated special funds of the state institutions of higher 179 learning or the state community or junior colleges; special funds 180 of Mississippi Industries for the Blind, the State Port at Gulfport, Yellow Creek Inland Port, Pat Harrison Waterway 181 182 District, Pearl River Basin Development District, Pearl River Valley Water Management District, Tombigbee River Valley Water 183 184 Management District, Yellow Creek Watershed Authority, or Coast Coliseum Commission; special funds of the Department of Wildlife, 185 186 Fisheries and Parks derived from the issuance of hunting or 187 fishing licenses; and special funds generated by agencies whose primary function includes the establishment of standards and the 188 189 issuance of licenses for the practice of a profession within the 190 State of Mississippi.

191 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 192 and after its passage.
