SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 509

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND DEDICATED 2 PUBLIC SERVICE OF THE HONORABLE STEPHEN J. KIRCHMAYR OF JACKSON, 3 MISSISSIPPI, LONGTIME COUNSEL FOR THE STATE COLLEGE BOARD AND 4 COURT ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE MISSISSIPPI SUPREME COURT, AND 5 EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

6 WHEREAS, the Honorable Stephen J. Kirchmayr of Jackson,
7 Mississippi, Counsel and Court Administrator for the Mississippi
8 Supreme Court and the state court system, passed away on Tuesday,
9 October 4, 2005, at his home; and

10 WHEREAS, Mr. Kirchmayr, an attorney, worked in public service 11 for 28 years in the office of the State Attorney General, at the 12 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and at 13 the Mississippi Supreme Court. He served under four state 14 attorneys general and five chief justices of the Mississippi 15 Supreme Court; and

16 WHEREAS, for the past 12 years, Mr. Kirchmayr served as 17 Counsel and Court Administrator to the Mississippi Supreme Court. 18 He oversaw financial operations, personnel, planning and all other 19 non-judicial functions of the Mississippi Supreme Court and Court 20 of Appeals; and

21 WHEREAS, as Supreme Court Administrator, he oversaw 22 implementation of a new court system for the state after the Legislature created the 10-member Court of Appeals in 1994. He 23 24 oversaw technological improvements for the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals and the state trial courts. He supervised programs which 25 made the decisions, docket and oral arguments of the Supreme Court 26 27 and Court of Appeals available to the public via the Internet. He oversaw resource improvements for trial courts; and 28

WHEREAS, from 1992-1993, Mr. Kirchmayr served as Special 29 30 Assistant to the Commissioner of Higher Education, he joined the 31 office of then-Attorney General A.F. Summer as an Assistant State Attorney General in 1977, providing legal advice and 32 33 representation to state and local government officials and state 34 agencies. In 1985, he became Deputy Attorney General, second-in-command under then-Attorney General Edwin L. Pittman, a 35 position he held until 1992; and 36

37 WHEREAS, Mr. Kirchmayr was born September 6, 1942, in
38 Vicksburg, Mississippi. He graduated from St. Aloysius High
39 School. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the
40 University of Southern Mississippi in 1964. He earned a Juris
41 Doctorate degree from the Mississippi School of Law in 1972. He
42 worked in private law practice in Jackson, Mississippi, for five
43 years before joining the office of the Attorney General; and

WHEREAS, he was a member of the Mississippi Bar Association, 44 the Hinds County Bar Association, the Federal Bar Association and 45 the Mississippi Court Administrators' Association. 46 He was a fellow of the Mississippi Bar Foundation and a former member of 47 48 the Charles Clark Chapter of American Inns of Court. He served as Secretary of the Conference of Mississippi Judges. From 1991 to 49 50 1993, he served as a member of Civil Justice Reform Act Advisory Committee for the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of 51 Mississippi. He was a former Chairman of the Governmental Law 52 53 Section of the Mississippi Bar Association. He was a member of 54 the St. James Episcopal Church. Mr. Kirchmayr was a private pilot 55 who enjoyed going to the circus and playing practical jokes; and 56 WHEREAS, Mr. Kirchmayr was preceded in death by his parents, 57 Stephen and Earline Kirchmayr. Survivors include his wife, Kathy Crowder Kirchmayr, Jackson, Mississippi; son, Stephen Kirchmayr, 58 59 Jackson, Mississippi; daughter, Deidra Kirchmayr O'Connor and her 60 husband, the Reverend Edward F.
